THE READINGS

The Old Testament - Jeremiah 23:1-6

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Holy One. Therefore thus says the Holy One, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Holy One. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply.

I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing. The days are surely coming, declares the Holy One, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king

and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness."

The New Testament - Luke 23:33-43

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "God, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, God's chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who was hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

The Continuing Testament - from *Christ the King -* by J. Barry Vaughn [edited]

This world's kingdoms are about power and prestige; Jesus is about service and humility. The rulers of this world are about coercion and violence; Jesus' life is characterized by peace and reconciliation. The irony of the crucifixion is that Jesus is sentenced to die for claiming to be a king. However, even while being nailed to the cross, Jesus demonstrates that it's his executioners who are in need of a royal pardon, and that he has the power to grant it. In pardoning those who execute him, Jesus shows us the power of forgiveness. In forgiving others, we too can exercise a majestic, Christlike power and grace....

Kings and rulers are usually surrounded by throngs of flatterers. In contrast, Jesus surrounds himself with the poor and marginalized. He crosses social and religious boundaries by accepting women as disciples. His critics charge that he eats and drinks with sinners and prostitutes. And even on the cross, Jesus continues his habit of associating with society's despised and disreputable. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom," prayed the penitent thief; and it is our prayer as well. We make our prayer to Christ the King, whose arms are *always* outstretched in love.
