# THE READINGS

# The Old Testament - Leviticus 19:9-18

The Holy One spoke to Moses, saying: "When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Sovereign One, your God.

You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Holy One. You shall not defraud your neighbor; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a laborer until morning. You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind; you shall revere your God: I am the Holy One. You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbor. You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbor: I am the Holy One. You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall admonish your neighbor when appropriate, or you will incur guilt yourself. You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Holy One.

## The New Testament - Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus says, "You have heard that it was said of old, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also; and if anyone wants to sue you and take your coat, give your cloak as well; and if anyone forces you to go one mile, go also the second mile. Give to everyone who begs from you, and do not refuse anyone who wants to borrow from you.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Heavenly Parent; who makes the sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your brothers and sisters, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Be perfect, therefore, as your Heavenly Parent is perfect.

# **The Continuing Testament** - by Russell Rathbun - in *The Hardest Question* [edited]

The Hebrew Scripture declares "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." In other words, don't hate your neighbor, don't judge her, don't steal from him, and don't show deference to one over another - love them all equally. But who is my neighbor? Jesus' response to that question was to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan.

The way the Good Samaritan story was always interpreted for me, emphasized the "Other". My neighbor was really someone who was different from me, foreign to me. I should treat them as one of my own. That of course is laudable, but maybe it lets me off the hook with the person who lives next door. I think the issue of proximity, takes

precedent over similarity or dis-similarity. The Hebrew Holiness Code tries to spell-out how people can live peacefully and interact positively with the people who are beside them every day.

Collecting food or money to send away to people ravaged by disaster or war is a worthy, and one might even say loving, action; but it is not the kind of love being referred to in the Scriptures. In truth, it's really not possible to love crowds of people at a distance. It is only possible to love the people I know, the people I encounter at the grocery store or in traffic, the people who are around me day-in and day-out.

# Dorothy Mary Luti

"You knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made." - Psalm 139:14

After some last minute drama with the birth mother—no one could find her for several days—a baby girl was safely delivered, ahead of schedule, on New Year's Day. After a short waiting period, the birth mother gave her final assent to the adoption, and the adoptive parents gave the baby a name—Dorothy, gift of God.

Soon after her birth, she began showing signs of drug withdrawal. She'd have to stay in the hospital until she finished treatment. No one could say how long. Her new parents would have to stay there too, complicating their plans with many unknowns.

When her new grandparents found out, they were alarmed. Her new aunts and uncles wondered if the adoption had been a good idea. Her new parents' friends texted and talked about people they knew whose adopted children had begun life like Dorothy, physically ill, laden with emotional question marks. Their stories about raising those kids were painful. Maybe it would've been better to hold out for a healthier birth mother, a healthier child.

But it was too late. The adoptive parents had already seen their child. They'd already given her her name. They'd already held her, smelled her smell, smoothed her damp dark hair. And, forgetting all the songs they ever knew, they'd made up new songs, just for her.

If you could hear them sing to their beautiful sick child, you would know who God is. You would have to remind yourself to breathe.

# **Prayer**

Nothing warns you away from us, O God. Nothing about us gives you pause. You don't look elsewhere for better children. You've already sung us our song, the one you made up just for us, sick and beautiful and wanted. Praise to you now and always. Amen.
