THE READINGS

The Old Testament - Psalm 86:1-12

Incline your ear, O Holy One, and answer me, for I am miserable and in needy. Preserve my life, for I am devoted to you; save your servant who trusts in you. You are my God; be gracious to me, for to you do I cry-out all day long. Gladden the soul of your servant, for to you, O Gracious One do I lift up my soul. For you, O Merciful One are good and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to all who call on you. Give ear to my prayer; listen to my cry of supplication.

In the day of my trouble I call on you, for you will answer me. There is none like you among the gods, O Sovereign One, nor are there any works like yours. All the nations you have made shall come and bow down before you, and shall glorify your name. For you are great and do wondrous things; you alone are God. Teach me your way, O Holy One, that I may walk in your truth; give me a true heart to revere your name. I give thanks to you, Gracious God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify your name forever.

The New Testament - Matthew 10:24-39

Jesus says, "A student is not above the teacher, nor a servant above the master; it is enough for the student to be like the teacher, and the servant like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household! So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing is secret that will not be revealed. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear the one who can destroy both soul and body in hell.

Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Heavenly Parent's knowledge. Even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows. Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Heavenly Parent; but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Heavenly Parent. Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a son against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and one's foes will be members of one's own household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves not take up the

cross and follow me is not worthy of me. For those who would save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it.

The Continuing Testament - from Sarah Laughed - by Sarah Dylan Breuer [edited]

Sooner or later, if you're a part of Christ's ministry, you'll find yourself making contact with wounded people, who are likely to respond to any attempt at ministry with confusion, anger and anguish. Wounded people often have a hard time trusting the motives of anyone who tries to participate in their lives. The best thing that you or I can do in a situation like that is to simply be present and loving; that's the only way to disrupt the cycle of pain and violence. That's hard to do, though, when someone is responding to your efforts to help, with distrust and anger. In a situation like that, we're understandably tempted to withdraw, or even to lash out with anger ourselves. I think part of what makes us feel that way, is that contact with another person's deep wounds often reminds us of our own wounds and vulnerabilities that we've tried to forget.

That's why we who seek to carry forward Christ's ministry must remind ourselves to stay grounded in God's unwavering love. When we remember how much and how unconditionally God loves and values us, we won't be thrown off-center by anyone's attempts to make us feel as worthless as they do. When we remember how powerful God's healing love is, we won't have to flee from those things or people that remind us of our own vulnerabilities and wounds. And when we remember what God's love looks like in the person of Jesus Christ, we will know how to respond. The Christ-like ministry that we embody can't be stopped by anger, hatred or violence. As the story of Easter reminds us, even death itself cannot stop the Eternal Spirit of Life and Love.
