The Old Testament - Psalm 150

Praise the Almighty with clanging cymbals; praise God with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that breathes praise the Holy One! Praise be to God!

The New Testament - Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled the

entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. And at this sound a crowd gathered and was bewildered, because they all heard them speaking, in each ones native language. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native tongue? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts, Cretans and Arabs - in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's great deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "People of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show signs in the heaven above and on the earth below - blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Holy One's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of God shall be saved.'

The Continuing Testament - from *Think Differently About Difference* - by Eric Barreto [edited]

Christians have often hoped for a time when our racial and economic differences cease, when in Christ we would all be indistinguishable. Such impulses are sincere, but misguided. The story of Pentecost helps us understand how God sees human diversity: as one of God's greatest gifts to the world. At Pentecost, God doesn't erase our differences, but embraces the fact that we are all so wonderfully different. Many have viewed Pentecost as a direct response to the Tower of Babel - a fantastic story that seeks to explain how people once united by common ancestors eventually became peoples with many different languages. At Pentecost, we can finally understand one another because the Spirit enables all to understand. This is a significant misreading. If Pentecost were a reversal of Babel, why would the Spirit enable

everyone to hear the Gospel preached in their own language? Why not cause everyone to understand one, universal language?

At Pentecost, God chooses to meet us where we are: in the midst of a multitude of languages and experiences. The Spirit translates the Good News of Jesus into numerous languages. If you think this is easy, then you've never tried learning a new language! Language is messy and intricate, rooted in wide and complex cultural ways of thinking and living. Even when we speak the same language, we still have a hard time understanding one another. At Pentecost, God meets us in the messy chaos of our different languages, and chooses to speak our many languages. God's choice clear: to join us in the midst of the messiness and difficulties of speaking different languages, eating different foods, and living in different cultures.

The problem we face across cultures, is not our differences. It's when we imbue those differences with judgements and prejudice; when our differences become a way to determine who is in and who is out - who is better and who is inferior. It is then that we corrupt the Divine Gift of Diversity. So, let us set aside those prejudices that infect our relationships with one another. They are poisons that lead to hatred and destruction. But let us also set aside the equally infectious, equally destructive delusion that our differences are a problem to be solved; that the solution to our many problems is a color-blind society where, as Stephen Colbert so brilliantly satirizes, we "don't see race." Such self-delusion is may be as harmful as direct prejudice, for they both work on the same logic: That it's better to be the same than to be different. For God's Wonderfully Diverse Family, nothing could be further from the truth.
