THE READINGS

The Old Testament - Hosea 6:1-6

The prophet Hosea says, "Come, let us return to the Holy One; for it is God who has torn, it is God who will heal us; God has struck us down, yet God will bind us up. After two days God will revive us; on the third day, will raise us up anew, that we may live before God. Let us know this, and let us press on to know the Holy One - whose appearing is as sure as the dawn; who will come to us like the showers, like the spring rains that water the earth.

What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. Therefore I have laid them low by my prophets, I have devoured them by the words of my mouth, and my judgment goes forth as the light. For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than your burnt offerings.

The New Testament - Matthew 11:28-30

Jesus says, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

The Continuing Testament - from *The Meaning of Jesus* - by Marcus Borg [edited]

Our common religious questions center on belief. "Do you believe in God?" "Do you believe the Bible is the Word of God?" "Do you believe Jesus is the Son of God?" Our preoccupation with believing is because many of the central teaching of Christianity have come into question in the modern world. Thinking of the Christian faith as being primarily about believing in God, the Bible, and Jesus is thus a modern mistake, with profound consequences.

Beliefs have little ability to change our lives. One can believe all the right things and remain a jerk, or worse. Saints have been heretical, and people with the correct beliefs have been cruel oppressors and brutal persecutors. Rather, the Christian life is about a relationship to the God to whom the tradition points. What matters is the relationship, for it can and does transform lives.

In all of this, for us as Christians, Jesus is central. I define the Christian life most compactly as a relationship with God as revealed in Jesus Christ. The core Christian affirmation is twofold: Jesus is for us Christians, the decisive revelation of what God is like and of what a life full of God is like. Jesus is the revelation, disclosure, and epiphany of both. As both "true God" and "true human," Jesus is a lens through which we see God and what a life full of God is like.
