

#### THE READINGS

#### The Old Testament - Psalm 106:1-5; 48

Praise the Holy One! Give thanks to God, who is good; whose steadfast love endures forever. Who can count the mighty deeds of our Gracious Creator, or declare all of wonderful works of the Holy One? Happy are those who follow God's way, who observe justice and do righteousness throughout their lives.

Remember me, O Holy One, when you bless your people; help me when you deliver them. That I may see the abundance of your grace that I may rejoice in the gladness of your people that I may glory in your life-long generosity....

Blessed be the Holy One, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! And let all the people say, "Amen! Praise God!"

#### The New Testament - Matthew 22:1-14

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: "The Realm of God may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited to the banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his servants, mistreated them, and killed them.

The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the

wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' The man silent and said nothing. So the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

## **The Continuing Testament** - from *In the Meantime... - by* David Lose

We are disciples of Jesus who hear the Good News that God invites all - good and bad - because God is a God of expansive love and radical inclusiveness. And we are disciples who see, especially in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, not only how far God will go to extend this invitation, but also that God's words of love and forgiveness are more powerful than any words of punishment, hate, or fear.

Because we have seen and experienced Divine Love first hand, we can trust that the God we know in Jesus cares for those who don't respond to God's invitation, just as graciously as God cares for us. If we practice trusting Divine Love enough to resist condemning others; but instead pray for them, we might find ourselves more capable of sharing why what we believe is important to us [rather than just insisting that they also believe]. We also might learn to show greater respect for their questions, beliefs, and struggles. And we might offer our care and support in the Spirit of the One who died, rather than condemn; and was raised to offer peace, rather than retribution. And this gracious understanding and loving support, may just be the most powerful witness we can offer.

# "The Problem of Pleasure" Matt Fitzgerald

"You open your hand, satisfying the desire of every living thing." - Psalm 145:16

My father loved roller coasters. They terrify me. When I was eight we went to Busch Gardens. He enjoyed the brewery tour. I ate cotton candy. Then he made me ride a gigantic yellow roller coaster. I closed my eyes and gripped the crash bar so tightly my knuckles turned bone white. And I wondered "Why?" Why would anyone invent such an awful machine? Why would my dad drag me on it? Who thinks this is fun? Why did I eat that cotton candy?

It finally stopped. I teetered my way out of the cart. My dad looked into my twirling pupils and green face and said, "Let's do it again!"

The second time I kept my eyes open. From the top of the ride I saw giraffes in the distance; their necks just long enough to eat the tops of trees just high enough to meet them. I saw a crowd of 500 people laugh as a killer whale leapt out of his pool to breach, grab a fish from his trainer's hand and splash each one of them as he smashed back into the water.

Just as we hit the apex and started the plunge I saw my father smiling like a little child as the sudden rush of wind lifted the horseshoe fringe from the sides of his bald head. Everything I saw was beautiful. But the thing is, this time around I didn't bother to ask why.

G.K. Chesterton's prayer, below, is perfect.
