# The Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 1:11-20

What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices? says the Holy One; I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams and the fat of fed beasts; I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats. When you come to appear before me, who asked this from your hand? Trample my courts no more; bringing offerings is futile; incense is an abomination to me. New moon and Sabbath and calling of convocation - I cannot endure solemn assemblies with iniquity. My soul hates your new moons and your appointed festivals; they have become a burden to me, I am weary of bearing them. When you stretch out your hands, I will hide my eyes from you; even though you make many prayers, I will not listen; your hands are full of blood.

Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your doings from before my eyes. Cease to do evil, learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow. Come now, let us reason together, says the Holy One: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be like snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool. If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land; but if you refuse and rebel, you shall be devoured by the sword; for the mouth of the Holy One has spoken.

### The New Testament - Mark 13:26-37

Jesus says, Then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Sovereign One. Be on guard and stay awake; for you do not know when the time will come. It's like a person going on a journey, who when leaving, puts the servants in charge, each of them with their own tasks, and commands the doorkeeper to be on watch. Therefore, keep awake - for you do not know when the master of the house will come - in the evening, at midnight, before dawn, or at sunrise - lest he find you asleep when he suddenly arrives. Therefore, what I say to you, I say to all: Keep awake!

### **The Continuing Testament** - from *Two Minute Warning* - by Russell Levenson [edited]

Jesus' words about his return are not designed to prompt people to fear, but rather to take action. In football, the "Two Minute Warning" doesn't indicate that the game is over, it announces now is the time get it in gear and really play! What Jesus' "warning" can prod us to do, is the primary duty of faithful servants: to care for the household in a way that if the Owner were to return today - or a thousand years from now - that Owner would be pleased to find the good stewardship the servants had carried-out. What might this look like for you and me today?

If this world and our lives are gifts entrusted to us from our Divine Creator, then it matters deeply that we believe this and live accordingly. It matters that we take seriously the call to follow Jesus' way of compassion and grace - because that was at the core of his life and teaching. It matters how we treat this world of ours, because we are called to care for the entire Creation. It matters deeply how we treat one another - how we live with our families, spouses, children, friends; how we care for our classmates, colleagues and coworkers. And it really matters how we treat strangers, the hungry, the homeless, the lonely, and the lost - those people who may not be in a position to repay our kindness. When we do these things well, we will not be afraid or worried or even surprised at the Owner's return - we will simply be overjoyed!
