

# The Readings

#### The Old Testament - Genesis 1:1-10; 31

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth, and the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while the Breath of God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness, Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, "Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day. And God said, "Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together, Seas. And God saw that it was good....

God saw everything that God had made, and indeed, it was all very good!

#### The New Testament - Mark 1:4-11

John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens open-up

and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. And a voice came from heaven saying, "You are my Child, my Beloved; with you I am well pleased!"

**The Continuing Testament** - from You'll Know It When It Happens - by Caspar Green [Edited]

Baptism might just get you wet. Or it might just change your life. In itself, there's nothing magical about a dip in the water. Even if it's a religiously motivated one, with a formal liturgy, specially blessed water, godparents, and the whole works. What makes it special is what you do with it after you get out of the water.

Talk about baptism almost inevitably leads to arguments about what the proper way to do it is (immersion, sprinkling, pouring) and when is the proper time (infancy, childhood, teenagers, or full-grown adults), and whose name is invoked and how. But really, baptism doesn't have to follow any formula or time or semantics at all.

Whether or not there was any water involved at the moment it happened, your baptism is when you realize who you are at your very core, and you joyfully accept that realization. God says, "You are my beloved child, and that pleases me!" When you truly realize this, the pure joy and assurance that it brings will change the way you live-out the rest of your life.
