THIS YEAR'S LENTEN STUDY, THE ABC'S OF OUR FAITH will be held on Tuesdays from 7:15-8:30 pm in Pilgrim Hall, beginning February 24th. The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 147:1-11

Praise the Holy One! How good it is to sing praise to God, who is gracious - to raise a suitable song of praise! The Holy One builds-up Jerusalem, and gathers the outcasts of Israel. The Gracious One heals the brokenhearted, and binds up their wounds. Our Holy Creator determines the number of the stars, and knows them all. Great is the Sovereign One, whose power is abundant and whose understanding is beyond measure.

The Holy One lifts up the downtrodden, and casts the wicked to the ground. Sing to the Holy One with thanksgiving; make melody to God on the harp. The Holy One covers the heavens with clouds, prepares rain for the earth, and makes grass grow on the hills. The Divine Source of all living things gives to the animals their food, and provides for the young birds when they cry. God's delight is not in the strength of the warhorse, nor in the speed of the runner. The Holy One takes pleasure in those who show reverence, and in those who hope and trust God's steadfast love.

The New Testament - Matthew 7:1-5; 24-29

"Do not judge, so that you may not be judged. For with the judgment you make you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get. Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbor, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' while the log is in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye...."

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise person who built a house on rock. The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish person who built a house on sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell - and great was its fall!" Now when Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes.

The Continuing Testament - from *The Politics of Church Survival* - by Timothy Simpson [edited]

I have sat through countless children's sermons in which the presenter asks the kids, "Do you know what the Church is?" Invariably, little Johnny or Susie will pipe up and say, "The building!" Whereupon all the adults will smile knowingly at the trap into which the little tyke has fallen. "No" the presenter replies, "the Church is all of us!" Whereupon the adults will smile knowingly. As I see it, however, the biggest challenge on this front facing us today is not the children confusing the Church for the building, but rather the adults confusing the Church with the institution.

So much of the Church's energy these days is directed, unhelpfully, into institutional survival. It's a normal response towards any transgenerational undertaking: nobody wants the Church

to fold on our watch! But what we are actually witnessing is the folding of administrative structures, of buildings, of staffing arrangements, and financial surpluses. None of that is the Church. They've been nice accounterments that have helped the Church do its work, but they were always add-ons, side dishes, non-essential elements that perhaps made life easier and more manageable, but nothing more.... The true source of the Church's life and strength is Jesus Christ, the son of the Living God.... It is in him that we find our strength, our unity, our community and - most importantly - our future.
