The Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 25:1; 4-8

O Holy One, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name; for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure.... You have been a refuge to the poor, a refuge to the needy in their distress, a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat. When the blast of the ruthless was like a winter rainstorm, the cries of the oppressed aliens like heat in a dry place, you subdued the heat with the shade of clouds; the song of the ruthless was stilled.

On this mountain the Holy One will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And God will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; God will swallow up death forever. Then the Holy One will wipe away the tears from all faces, and God will take away from all the earth the disgrace of people, for the Holy One has spoken.

The New Testament - Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

The Continuing Testament - from *Whistling in the Dark*- by Frederick Buechner [edited]

With Easter, the Gospels are far from clear as to just what happened. It began in the dark. The stone had been rolled aside. In the tomb there were two white-clad figures, or possibly just one. Mary Magdalen seems to have gotten there before anybody else. One account says Peter came too, with one of the other disciples. Elsewhere the suggestion is that there were

only the women, and that the disciples didn't believe the women's story when they heard it. Matthew speaks of "fear and great joy." Confusion was everywhere. There is no agreement even as to the role of Jesus himself. Did he appear at the tomb, or only later? What did he say? What did he do?

It's not really even much of a story when you come right down to it. It doesn't have the ring of great drama. It has the ring of truth.... The narrative is as fragmented, shadowy, incomplete as Life itself. When it comes to exactly what happened, there can be no certainty. That something unimaginable happened, there can be no doubt. The symbol of Easter is the empty tomb. You can't depict or domesticate emptiness. It ebbs and flows all around us, the Eastertide. Jesus rose. A few saw him briefly and talked to him. If it is true, there is nothing left to say. If it is not true, there is nothing left to say. For believers and unbelievers alike, Life has never been the same again....neither has death.
