


NEWS FROM OCWM

At the last hunger meal, on April 19th at the Pearl Road United Methodist Church in partnership with St. Peter UCC, about 80 meals



were served, including seconds and takeout's. About 12 to 15 people set up and prepared, and about 10 to 12 people served and cleaned up. The budget for the meal was \$200.00, and the cost was \$186.00.

The food donations continue to come in. During April and May, 43 bags and one box of food items, 3 bags of dental supplies, 2 bags of toiletries, 4 bags of clothing, one bag of baby food, 2 working electric shavers, one bag of miscellaneous and empty bags were delivered to Community Corner and Brookside. Thanks go to Dave Bernard for providing the transportation.

On Sunday, June 14th, the Strengthen The Church offering will be received. The funds will be used to help establish new churches, revitalize existing churches, develop spiritual life in young people, and help fund the "Still Speaking" campaign (speaking out when appropriate. Interpretive literature will be included in the Sunday bulletins leading up to June 14th.
