The Readings

The Old Testament - from II Samuel Chapter 6

David and all the people with him set out and went from Baal-judah, to bring from there the Ark of the Covenant, which is called by the name of the Holy One of hosts who is enthroned on the cherubim. They carried the Ark on a new cart, and brought it out of the house of Abinadab. Uzzah and Ahio, the sons of Abinadab, were driving the cart with the Ark; and Ahio went in front of the Ark. David and all the house of Israel were dancing before the Holy One with all their might, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals....

....So David brought up the Ark of the Covenant to the City of David with rejoicing; and when those who bore the Ark had gone six paces, he sacrificed an ox and a fatling. David danced before the Holy One with all his might; David was girded with a linen loincloth. So David and all the house of Israel brought up the Ark of the Covenant with shouting, and with the sound of the trumpet. As the Ark of the Covenant came into the City of David, Michal daughter of Saul looked out of the window, and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Holy One; and she despised him in her heart. They brought in the Ark and set it in its place, inside the tent that David had pitched for it; and David offered burnt offerings and offerings of well-being before the Holy One. When he had finished, he blessed the people in the name of the Holy One, and distributed food among all the people, the whole multitude of Israel, both men and women. Then all the people went back to their homes.

David returned to bless his household. But Michal came out to meet him and said, "How the king of Israel honored himself today, uncovering himself before the eyes of his maids like some vulgar, ill-bred commoner might shamelessly uncover himself!" David said to Michal, "It was before the Holy One, who chose me in place of your father and all his household, to appoint me as prince over Israel that I have danced. I will make myself even more undignified than this, and I will be humbled in my own eyes; but by the maids of whom you have spoken, by them I shall be held in honor!"

The New Testament - Mark 6:14-28

King Herod heard of Jesus' ministry, for Jesus' name had become well known. Some were saying, "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him." But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised!"

For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." And Herodias had a grudge against John, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard John, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee.

When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it." And he solemnly swore to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom." She went out and said to her mother, "What should I ask for?" She replied, "The head of John the baptizer." Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately he sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother.
