



The Readings

The Old Testament - Exodus 14:13-17; 21-22

Moses said to the people of Israel, "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Holy One will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again. The Holy One will fight for you, and you have only to keep still."

Then the Holy One said to Moses, "Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers....

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Holy One drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left.

The New Testament - Mark 6:41-52

Taking the five loaves and the two fish, Jesus looked up to heaven, blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all. And all ate and were filled; and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces of the bread and of the fish. Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand. Immediately Jesus made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

When evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and Jesus was alone on the land. When he saw that they were straining at the oars against an adverse wind, he came towards them early in the morning, walking on the sea. He intended to pass them by. But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out; for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Then he got into the boat with them and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were closed.

The Continuing Testament - from *Miracles Require Hope* - by Nancy Rockwell [edited]

Everywhere Jesus went, there were crowds of empty, aching folk who believed Jesus was the answer to their needs....They wanted miracles, because they believed they could not meet their own needs. Jesus, though, kept asking them to feed each other, kept telling them they could do this - they could meet each other's needs and find the fullness of Life they sought in one another. They needed to believe in themselves, and to have *hope*. The disciples were scared to try to feed such a hungry crowd, to accomplish something so incredible. But Jesus urged them to try. The struggle was between their fear of failure - and their *hope*. When they finally did as Jesus asked; when they tried offering the little they had, to the vast hunger of the crowd, *everyone* was fed! Fed by one another, as that food was passed from hand to hand.

Who can explain a miracle? How many *hands* are involved in it, how many *hopes*, how many human souls? Who can explain where Life comes from, or how Life can even come from death? Who can explain the slaughter of nine beautiful lives in a church prayer group in South Carolina, and the fear and horror set loose by it? Who can explain how that horrible event could be turned into a powerful public conversation - voices and prayers rising so convincingly, that already impossible things have happened? The Confederate flag has come down at the South Carolina state capitol, and at the Alabama state capitol, and is no longer allowed to be used at National Parks or Memorials or Cemeteries. What raised the Confederate flag 50 years ago, was resistance to Civil Rights. What brought it down this week was thousands of human voices saying "No More of This!" We have all been given a Feast of Hope by the public conversations, and by the legislative actions. And we need to say "Amen" - because a miracle has happened, and we have seen it with our own eyes!
