### Readings

### The Old Testament - 1 Kings 3:5-12

At Gibeon the Holy One appeared to Solomon in a dream by night and said, "Ask what I should give you." And Solomon said, "You have shown great and steadfast love to your servant my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart toward you; and you have kept for him this great and steadfast love, and have given him a son to sit on his throne today. And now, O Sovereign One, you have made your servant king in place of my father David, although I am only a little child; I do not know how to go out or come in. And your servant is in the midst of the people whom you have chosen, a great people, so numerous they cannot be numbered or counted.

Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil; for who can govern this your great people?" It pleased the Holy One that Solomon had asked this. The Holy One said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for yourself long life or riches, or for the life of your enemies, but have asked for yourself understanding to discern what is right, I now do according to your word. Indeed I give you a wise and discerning mind; no one like you has been before you, and no one like you shall arise after you.

#### The New Testament - Matthew 7:7-12

Jesus says, "Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, everyone who seeks finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone? Or if the child asks for a fish, will give a snake? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Heavenly Parent give good things to those who ask! In everything you do, do unto others as you would have them do unto you; for this is the essence of the Law and the Prophets."

**The Continuing Testament** - from *Do Unto Others: Everyone, Everywhere!* - by Ann Kroeker [edited]

One practical step toward living the "Golden Rule" involves increased awareness. Becoming more attuned to others, we'll more likely see their needs and respond appropriately. We can make eye contact and learn people's names. Listen to what they're saying and ask questions. And smile! As we begin to interact more with people - whether strangers, friends, or coworkers - they'll probable take notice and respond. Hopefully, they'll receive our attention with gratitude and respect; yet Jesus tells us to "do unto others" regardless of the responses we receive in return.

We can bring in the neighbor's trash cans, house-sit while someone travels, rake leaves or shovel snow. We can hold the door for a stranger at the post office; or let the harried mom and her squealing toddler go ahead of us in the checkout line, because we'd sure appreciate someone doing that for us! And though our families represent the people we love the most, some of us struggle to "do unto others" at home. We may be considered an attentive, compassionate coworker at the office, but then we come home tired and cranky, and we tune everyone out. Yet when Jesus says "do unto others," he doesn't restrict who those "others" are. Our families certainly deserve the same attentiveness as those we encounter outside the home - if not more! Wherever we are, in big ways and small, we are called to look to the interests of others - by treating, serving, and loving, them just as we'd like to be treated ourselves.
