Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Holy One, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! If you, O Gracious One, should mark iniquities, who could possibly stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered.

I wait for the Holy One, my soul waits, and in the Holy One's word I hope. My soul waits for the Compassionate One more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the sun to rise. O Israel, hope in the Holy One! For with the Gracious One there is steadfast love, and great power to redeem. It is the Holy One who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.

The New Testament - Philippians 4:1-13

Saint Paul writes, Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to the Holy One. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable - if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise - think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the Divine Source of peace will be with you all.

The Continuing Testament - by Jerome Creach - in *WorkingPreacher* [edited]

Once while leading a study tour of the Middle East, my group visited the chapel of the Hadassah hospital in Jerusalem. The attraction of the chapel was a set of stained-glass windows created by the artist Marc Chegal. The windows are set within a domed ceiling, so as to direct the worshiper heavenward. As we gazed at the windows, a member of our group noticed another feature of the chapel. Directly below the windows the floor was sunken, and in the middle of the depressed area was a pulpit. Curious about this design, we asked about this

architectural feature. The hospital representative explained, "The floor beneath the windows was made this way because we believe all prayer should be offered 'out of the depths.' "This explanation gave a nod to Psalm 130 - a Psalm best known for its first line, "Out of the depths I cry to you, O Holy One."

As the Psalm progresses, however, the Psalmist [and reader] do not remain mired in the depths. The final portion of the Psalm contains statements about waiting for and hoping in the Holy One: "I wait for the Holy One, my soul waits, and in the Holy One's word I hope." To wait in this way, is to live expectantly, with an awareness of how the Holy One has acted in the past, and with keen anticipation of what the Holy One is about to do. This kind of waiting is the opposite of anxiousness and hopelessness. It is like the watcher who anticipates, and finds, relief in the arrival of the dawn. The certainty of the coming light makes clear that the hopeful waiting is not delusional or unrealistic.
