

## *Pastor's Ponderings*

### *...on “Re-Focusing our Friendliness Factor”...*

If you were to ask just about anyone, “Is your church friendly?” most people would say, “Absolutely!” And they’d be right. Go into almost any church, and you’ll see the members greeting, smiling and talking with each other. The problem is, that when a first time visitor [or “stranger”] comes in, he or she is

often barely noticed. We members can be so engaged in catching-up with one another, that we fail to catch a glimpse of our newly arrived guests. Or we see that person, but simply continue our conversations, figuring that someone else will speak to them, or we’ll greet them later. We tend to forget how long even a minute can feel when we’re in a strange place - especially when surrounded by “friendly” people who seem to be ignoring us!

It’s important for us as Church members to think about how we meet, greet, and treat the “strangers” who come among us. It’s also important that we consider how people who are visiting us for the first time might feel as they wait to be greeted, or as they fumble-through some of those worship practices that are so familiar to us. Those people who have been personally invited by one of us - who have someone to greet them, sit with them and explain what’s happening - probably feel pretty welcome and at ease. And even those visitors who wander-in on their own may feel fairly comfortable, if they happen to have a Church background similar to ours. Of course, we do get those visitors who find us on our website or in a local publication, and bravely decide to check us out.

Oftentimes, it's because there's something happening in their lives that has triggered the desire for a spiritual or social connection: a move, a new job, a new child, or some personal problem or crossroad. These are the people who can really benefit from one of our member's personal attention and helpful hospitality.

For the most part, we at BUCC do a good job of spotting and welcoming our guests, but we can always strive to do better. Even if you're not sure if the person you see is a "first-timer" or an "old-timer", simply smiling, going up and saying "Hi, I'm Dave!" is a good way to break the ice. [Of course, if your name is Susan, it could be a bit awkward]. Some of the key times to be aware of those who visit us are when they first arrive [just walking through the door can be a big step for some]; pre-worship and announcement time [a chance to fill them in on what's happening and about to happen]; during the Passing of the Peace and Communion [briefly explain what's going on]; and when the worship service is over [help them move into our "Circle," personally invite them to Coffee Hour, walk with them down to Pilgrim Hall, and introduce them to others].

Perhaps the best way for us to be sensitive to those who are visiting, is to think back to a time when we ourselves were in a new place or situation. Think about how you felt; who helped you feel included; what they did; and how good that made you feel! We really are a "friendly church" - but it's important that each of us step-up our efforts, and watch for those visitors who come among us. If we do it right, we can help them feel that they are more than just visitors - that they truly are our welcomed guests!

### CHRISTIAN ED



This year, we will have three classes as listed below. We will not be facilitating a class for the high school students due to lack of participants (darn them all for growing up and going off to college! :-)

Food donations continue to appear in the upper commons, thanks to BUCC members and friends, including St. Bridget's Community. ## SPIRTUAL LIFE

BUCC has recently installed the latest, up-to-date version of the Williams personal sound system. It may just be your answer if you are concerned (1) that the quality of sound deteriorates between the speakers and your pew in the sanctuary, or (2) that your hearing is getting poorer but not yet bad enough to buy hearing aids, or (3) that you have hearing aids and you want to hear even better or (4) that you are bothered by the route 82 traffic noises or any noise generated by your pew mates during worship.



We have receivers for you to borrow which pick up the FM audio signal transmitted in our sanctuary every Sunday by our sound system. Just plug in your favorite Walkman head phones or any other unit with a 3.5mm plug and you are ready for a new hearing experience. Don't know if you want to do this? Then try it out; borrow one of the church's head phones and "test drive" a Williams receiver during a worship service.

If you already have hearing aids, an even better experience awaits you. Simply have your audiologist activate the teleloop option of your hearing aids, borrow a receiver with a teleloop and experience sound quality you never would have expected. The sound remains electronic all the way from the speaker's mic to your ear drum.

Members of the Spiritual Life Ministry, along with Max Roha, are ready to help you get started. Check with them before the service on any Sunday. Your questions are gladly answered.

## MUSIC



At Brecksville UCC we strive to be welcoming and inclusive in all of our ministries, and this is especially true for music. Thanks to the participation of dozens of BUCC members and friends, our vocal and instrumental ensembles and soloists are able to provide music for worship services on a regular basis. Here is a list of starting dates/times/ensemble descriptions for the 2015-2016 church season:

**Adult Choir** (high school and older welcome): First rehearsal is Thurs. Sept. 10 from 7:30-9:00 p.m. The choir's primary role is to lead the congregation's hymn-singing at worship and to present an anthem for reflection every Sunday. Ability to read music helpful but not required. A great opportunity to experience eclectic music, affirming fellowship and spiritual growth.

**Joyful Noise Choir** (K-5th grade): First practice is Thurs. Sept. 10 from 5:30-6:15. Young people in this group learn a variety of fun songs which we present at Sunday worship every 3-4 weeks. Through music, the children learn about Jesus, Bible stories, Christian values, the church season, etc; during the last part of practice we usually play a game or do some sort of activity, arts and crafts, etc. CDs are distributed to make the learning process easier for the kids.

**Recorder/Dulcimer Ensemble** (youth-adult): First rehearsal is Wed. Sept. 9 from 4:30-5:00. This instrumental group presents music at Sunday worship ~ once a month. Some hymns and songs are familiar, others more contemporary, some international in origin. Ability to play recorder or dulcimer helpful, but Dave D. is glad to teach beginners. (Times for these free lessons will depend on availability of participants/teacher.)

**Youth Percussion Group** (6th grade-adult): First practice is scheduled for Sunday Sept. 13 from 5:30-6:00 before youth ministry at 6. This ensemble accompanies music at Sunday worship as needed, including prelude, anthem, offertory, communion, and postlude pieces. Rehearsal schedule will change from month to month, so check the Pillar and weekly bulletins for dates.



**Instrumentalists** (youth-adult): If you play an instrument fairly well and would like to share your musical gifts during worship, please contact Dave and let him know you're interested. Instrumental parts can be written for you and we can rehearse as much or as little as you'd like ahead of time. If we have enough instruments to form

a small ensemble, this would be another fun option.

**Beginner harmonica lessons** (youth-adult): We will be offering beginner harmonica lessons this year for anyone interested in learning how to play (Dave D. is still learning the instrument himself, so don't be inhibited about trying!) Two longer-range goals: to form a small G harmonica ensemble, and/or to play along with the recorder/dulcimer ensemble, which is tuned to G major. Practice times for these lessons will depend on availability of participants/teacher. Contact Dave if you're interested. Instruments and music will be provided by the music department.

**Seasonal Choir** (high school-adult): Seasonal choir helps reinforce the regular choir for our annual Christmas cantata and Holy Week. This fall we'll begin weekly practices for the cantata on Thurs. Oct. 8 from 7:00-8 p.m. Rehearsal CDs for each vocal part are provided.

**Private piano lessons** (youth-adult): Private half-hour lessons will be offered on Wed. and Thurs. afternoons starting Sept. 9 and 10. Please contact Dave to schedule day/time for you or your child(ren).

I'm looking forward to the upcoming church season, during which we'll begin celebrating our 200th anniversary as a congregation. If you have any questions or concerns, or other ideas relating to our music program, please don't hesitate to contact me.


