

Readings

The Old Testament - Exodus 3:11-15

Moses said to the Holy One [who had spoken to him from the burning bush], "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" The Holy One replied, "I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship me on this mountain." But Moses said, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is God's name?' what shall I say to them?" The Holy One said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM! Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I AM has sent me to you." The Holy One also said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'The

Holy One, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you': This is my name forever, and this my title for all generations."

Now the Holy One said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you.

I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

So Abram went, as the Holy One had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan.

The New Testament - Hebrews Chapters 11 and 12

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not seen.... By faith Noah, warned by God about events as yet unseen, respected the warning and built an ark to save his household..... By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going.... By faith Isaac invoked blessings for the future on Jacob and Esau. By faith Jacob, when dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph.... By faith Joseph, at the end of his life, foretold of the Exodus of the Israelites....

By faith Moses was hidden by his parents for three months after his birth, because they saw that the child was special; and they were not afraid of the Pharaoh's edict. By faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called a son of Pharaoh, choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God.... By faith he left Egypt, unafraid of the Pharaoh's anger; for he persevered as though he saw the Holy One who is invisible.... By faith the people of Isreal passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land.... And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets - who through faith conquered territories, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness.....

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every burden, fear and evil that would linger around us, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from evildoers, so that you yourselves may not grow weary or lose heart.
