The Readings

The Old Testament - Micah 4:1-7

In days to come the mountain of the Holy One shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised up above the hills. Peoples shall stream to it, and many nations shall come and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Holy One, to the house of the God of Jacob; that the Holy One may teach us to walk in the paths of righteousness." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Holy One from Jerusalem. The Sovereign One shall judge between many peoples, and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away. And they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid. For the mouth of the Holy One has spoken.

For all the nations walk, each in the name of their own gods, but we shall all walk in the name of the One True God, forever and ever. In that day, says the Holy One, I will assemble the lame and gather those who have been driven away, and those who are afflicted. From the lame, I will form a community; and from those who were cast off, a strong nation. The Holy One will reign over them in Mount Zion, now and forevermore.

The New Testament - John 18:33-37

Then Pontius Pilate entered the courtyard again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own people and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My realm is not from this world. If my realm were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the authorities. But as it is, my realm is not from here." Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world: to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

The Continuing Testament - from *Pale Blue Dot* - by Carl Sagan [edited]

Look again at that dot. That's here. That's home. That's us. On it everyone you love, everyone you know, everyone you ever heard of, every human being who ever was, lived out their lives. The aggregate of our joy and suffering, thousands of confident religions, ideologies, and economic doctrines, every hunter and forager, every hero and coward, every creator and destroyer of civilization, every king and peasant, every young couple in love, every mother and father, hopeful child, inventor and explorer, every teacher of morals, every corrupt politician, every "superstar", every "supreme leader", every saint and sinner in the history of our species lived here - on a mote of dust suspended in a sunbeam.

The Earth is a very small stage in a vast cosmic arena. Think of the rivers of blood spilled by all those generals and emperors, so that, in glory and triumph, they could become the momentary masters of a fraction of a dot. Think of the endless cruelties visited by the inhabitants of one corner of this pixel on the scarcely distinguishable inhabitants of some other corner, how frequent their misunderstandings, how eager they are to kill one another, how fervent their hatreds.
