

## The Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 58:6-11

Thus says the Holy One, Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every chain? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to withhold your help from your own sisters and brothers?

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Holy One shall be your rear guard.

Then you shall call, and the Holy One will answer; you shall cry for help, and your deliverer will say, "Here I am!"

If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. The Holy One will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail.

#### The New Testament - John1:1-5; 9-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.... The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of human will, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a parent's only child, full of grace and truth.

## Continuing Testament - by Betsey Wilson -in BUCC Advent Devotional [edited]

It boils down to this... Mary and Joseph were displaced. They were far from home, without the comfort of family or friends. No one clapped Joseph on the back or handed out cigars. No experienced mother figure laid a cool hand on Mary's forehead or knowingly cradled the fussing baby. What was such a joyous time in my own life almost twenty-one years ago, would look drastically different under the light of such decidedly desperate circumstances.

Today, many mothers are still far from home, giving birth unaided, anxiously trying to feed and sooth distraught children; frightened, filthy, fatigued. The Syrian refugee crisis is a haunting reminder that the world is in just as much upheaval as

it was at the time of Jesus' humble birth. And yet. Bleak and dreary as it was, beauty bloomed in that desperate time and place.

Out of God's all-encompassing love, God reached out and made manifest a plan that was conceived before the world was born. We celebrate the fulfillment of that plan, in the birth of an innocent, far from home. Let's remember the displaced today - both in our own country, and across the world - that our thoughts and actions may honor that child born outside the inn.
