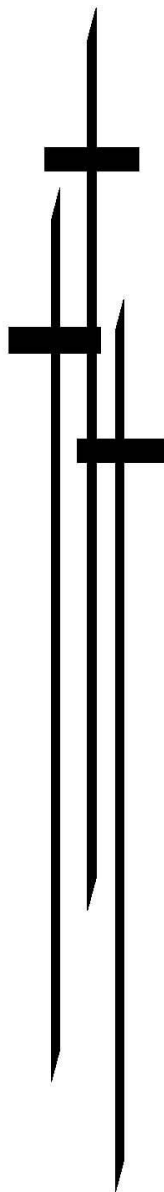

...and yet, here we are pushing 200! As we begin this new Calendar year of 2016, we enter the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the founding of Brecksville United Church of Christ. Even though the UCC wasn't formed until 1957, the forward-thinking attitude and bold witness of our modern-day denomination was clearly evident in the lives and faith of the hearty

Congregationalists and Presbyterians who first gathered here to worship. Just thirty-four years after the American Revolution, these men and women who planted our church's roots carried a spirit of independence and openness which recognized that there was still "more truth and light yet to break forth out of God's Holy Word."\* And just forty-five years before the issue of slavery would thrust our nation into a Civil War, the abolitionist stance of our early church members would be clearly expressed in both word and deed. From the very beginning, this community of faith has stood-up for those people who society in general was not ready to welcome, affirm or embrace.

Fast-forward 175 years. In 1991, televangelist Pat Robertson establishes the "American Center for Law and Justice" - an organization whose sole purpose is to fiercely fight against the basic equality that LGBT people are seeking in employment, housing, adoption, and marriage rights. That is just one of a multitude of religious organizations that will spend millions to "Keep America safe from...these perverted homosexuals who absolutely hate everything that decent, God-fearing citizens stand for."\*\* Fortunately, 1991 is also the same year that the compassionate and forward-thinking members of BUCC declare this congregation to be "Open and Affirming" of LGBT people.

And in October 2004, one month before 62% of Ohio residents vote to pass a State Constitutional amendment banning same-gender marriages, BUCC members vote to call an openly gay man to serve as their Pastor. [I understand he's still around!]

Our Faith may be 2,000 years old. Our Congregation may be 200 years old. Thankfully, however, our understanding and practice of the all-encompassing compassion of Jesus Christ continues to evolve and grow from generation to generation. As we usher in our congregation's 200<sup>th</sup> year of ministry, we celebrate a storied and remarkable past. And because of that unique past, we are poised on the edge of a truly promising future. At times throughout our history, this church may have seemed "way out there" in the eyes of our surrounding culture. Thankfully, however, society eventually catches-up! In the meantime, as long as you and I remain faithful to Christ's call to love our neighbor as we love ourselves, we will continue to be blessed and to be a blessing to others.

## NEWS FROM OCWM

The major activities during 2015 were centered around redemption of aluminum cans and provision of hunger meals. This was in addition to the receipt of designated offerings, and the delivery of donated food and other items to Brookside Hunger Center and Community Corner Hunger Center.



During 2015, a little over 473 pounds of aluminum cans plus some other metals were redeemed, yielding over \$228.00 for SARA. Since this effort began in 2002, over 4160 pounds of aluminum cans plus other metals have been redeemed, yielding over \$1830.00 for SARA and other mission outreach activities.

Four hunger meals were prepared and provided during 2015 – two at Pearl Road United Methodist Church and two at Bethany UCC. All told, about 445 meals were prepared and served to about 220 persons. The difference between the number of meals prepared and the number of persons served is due to second and takeaway meals. On one or two occasions, food left over was delivered to St. Herman's that day to aid in their provision of meals.

A large “thank you” goes to BUCC members and friends who so generously provided food and other items for delivery to Brookside and Community Corner. This also includes those persons who kept the mitten tree alive and well. To date, the tree has “filled up” twice and the hats and mittens have been delivered to the hunger center along with the food items. An exact count of items delivered has not been kept, but at least 237 bags and boxes were delivered in 2015. This includes toiletries, dental items, and other things not covered by food stamps. The hunger centers value the items above at about 10 dollars each, but the true value exceeds that by far.

Also in 2015, BUCC again received the five designated denomination offerings – CUE, Strengthen The Church, One Great Hour of Sharing, Neighbors In Need, and the Christmas Offering. In addition, a women's offering was received. This reflects the awareness of BUCC members and friends of the needs of others.

**Did you know** that our church organ is the result of many years of the giving of time and materials by the Ellenberger family? Ernest Ellenberger was a successful business man and longtime member of our church with a strong interest in organ, choral and classical music. He helped establish an organ building business with his son, Bill. They have gradually added new components and Bill still helps keep the organ in repair and operation. The core of our organ was recovered, mostly undamaged, from the ruins of the church after the 1965 fire. It has been extensively upgraded and expanded since then.

**Did you know** that BUCC used on-street parking in front of our church building for many years? That involved perpendicular parking on the south side of Rte. 82 and parallel parking on the north side. When the highway was widened to its present width, our church began an active program to acquire properties that could provide needed off-street parking. The first such purchases were the Barton and Tesmer properties immediately behind the church leading to Arlington Street which provided the space of only about 1/3 of our present parking area. This continued to be our only parking area until the Opening Door project was completed.
