

### The Readings

#### The Old Testament - Psalm 36:5-10

Your steadfast love, O Holy One, extends to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds. Your righteousness is like the mighty mountains, your judgments are like the great deep; you save humans and animals alike, gracious Creator. How precious is your steadfast love! All people may take refuge in the shadow of your wings. They feast on the abundance of your house, and you give them drink from the river of your delights. For with you is the fountain of life; in your light we see light. O continue your steadfast love to those who know you, and your salvation to the upright of heart!

### The New Testament - John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no wine." Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

**The Continuing Testament** - from *A Christmas Sermon on Peace* - by Martin Luther King, Jr. [1967 - edited]

If you lose hope, somehow you lose that vitality that keeps life moving, you lose that courage to be, that quality that helps you go on in spite of it all. And so today I still have a dream. I have a dream that one day people will rise-up and come to see that they are made to live together as brothers and sisters. I still have a dream that...every person will respect the dignity and worth of every human...that empty stomachs will be filled...that justice will roll down like thunder, and righteousness like a mighty stream!

I still have a dream today that in all of our state houses and city halls people will be elected who will do justly and love mercy and walk humbly with their God. I still have a dream that one day war will come to an end, that people will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks, that nations will no longer rise up against nations, neither will they study war any more....I still have a dream that with faith we will be able to adjourn the councils of despair, and bring new light into the dark chambers of pessimism....I still dream that we will be able to speed up the day when there will be peace on earth and good will toward all. It will be a glorious day! The morning stars will sing together, and the children of God will shout for joy!
