



# The Readings

## The Old Testament - Psalm 19:1-4; 7-11

The heavens declare the glory of the Holy One; and the firmament proclaims the Creator's handiwork. Each day announces it to the following day; each night repeats it to the next. No speech or words are used, no sound is heard; yet their message goes out to all the world and is heard to the ends of the earth....The Divine Law is perfect; reviving the soul. The commands of the Holy One are trustworthy, making wise the simple; the Heavenly Precepts are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of God is clear, enlightening the eyes; Reverence for God is good; enduring forever; the Divine Ordinances are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey, and drippings of the honeycomb. They give knowledge to me, your servant; in keeping them there is great reward.

#### The New Testament - Luke 4:14-30

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Holy One is upon me, and has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. God has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the Season of Divine favor." And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum.' " And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown.

But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon.

There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

## The Continuing Testament - from Jesus' Agenda - by Nancy Rockwell [edited]

Jesus' public announcement in his home-town synagogue declared that he was to "bring good news to the poor, release to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the Year of Divine Favor." Not much of this is being focused on in our Presidential candidates' public announcements. One or two focus on the economy and how it affects the poor, but most focus on immigration and terrorist aggression. There is hardly any mention of prisoners, or of prisons and their conditions. Much work has been done for the blind, yet Jesus' words are also about those who lack compassion because of their blindness to the needs of those around them. There is more emphasis on keeping the oppressed out of our nation than on helping them go free. And as for the Year of Divine Favor, which biblically is a year of redistribution of wealth and land, no candidate is talking about that.

Granted, it is a stretch to assume that Jesus' words, read from Isaiah, are the appropriate agenda for would-be world leaders. Yet they strike me as the remedy we need for our broken economy, our highest-in-the-western world rate of imprisonment and the shockingly large proportion of our prisoners who are black and Latino. And they ring true as the decent and moral response to throngs of oppressed refugees desperately seeking freedom. As a nation, we are deeply divided in our responses to refugees, the poor, and minorities. Ancient as Jesus' words are, still there is a ring of truth, that these are the priorities we must embrace.

Jesus' words challenge us to hear that he has not come to save us individually, apart from one another, or privately, through our personal belief; but he comes for us all, and is revealed in us and through us, as we reach out to embrace one another's needs. So many of our candidates profess to be Christians - it would be a welcome wonder if one of them were to have the
