The Readings

The Old Testament- Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff - they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

The New Testament - Revelation 7:9-17

Saint John Writes, after this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to the Holy One who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped the Holy One, singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to God forever and ever! Amen."

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worshiping day and night within the temple, and the One who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and will guide them to springs of the water of life, and the Holy One will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

The Continuing Testament - from *No, It's Not About That!* - by John Holbert [edited]

Do not allow anyone to make the book of *Revelation* into a thing of fear, partisan choice, or believing rightly lest you end-up in hell-fire. No! *Revelation* is about one thing: God wins and the powers of evil lose. And at the end of all things, God will make "all things new" - not "all new things!" Hence, all will live in a vast community together - Jews, Christians, Muslims, and all others. Crying and pain and sorrow will be gone. In short, the world will eventually be what God had in mind for it at the beginning - a place of order and harmony, a place ruled by love....

Hence, those who find *Revelation's* depiction of blood and doom and destruction as something literally to come, have not read the book for the metaphorical writing that it is. The 144,000 saints from *Revelation* Chapter 7 represent "a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." This is no "chosen few" but rather a vast, innumerable multitude, all praising the Lamb, all dressed in white robes, made white by the actions of the Lamb, not by their own power and victories; not by their "right belief" or rejection of those who think differently. *Revelation* is a great vision of the Divine Promise to create a world where all have a place, where hierarchies disappear, where all live together in harmony and peace. Do not allow anyone to make this book into a scary thing! It is a book of hope, founded in the love of the Lamb of God, for all people!
