

The Readings

The Old Testament - Amos 8:4-12

Hear this, you that trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, saying, "When will the New Moon celebration be over so that we may sell grain; and the Sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale? We will make the product small and the price great, and practice deceit with false balances, buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, and selling the worthless parts of the wheat." God has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds. Shall not the land tremble on this account, and everyone mourn who lives in it, and all of it rise like the Nile, and be tossed about and sink again, like the Nile of Egypt? On that day, says the Holy One, I will make the sun go down at noon, and darken the earth in broad daylight.

I will turn your feasts into mourning, and all your songs into lamentation; I will bring sackcloth on all loins, and baldness on every head; I will make it like the mourning for an only child, and the end of it like a bitter day.

The time is surely coming, says the Holy One, when I will send a famine on the land; not a famine of bread, or a thirst for water, but a great hunger for hearing the message of God. They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, seeking the word of God, but they shall not find it.

The New Testament - Luke 10:38-42

Now as Jesus and his disciples went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at Jesus' feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Teacher, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But Jesus answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

The Continuing Testament - from *The First Duty of Love Is to Listen* - by Gordon Livingston [edited]

No single characteristic reveals as much about a person as their ability to pay attention to others. As a therapist I wish I could say that people benefit most from the wisdom and brilliant insights that I bring. Truthfully, most of what I do is sit in silence and try to formulate questions that will assist patients to figure out what they should do to change their lives. To do this I must pay close attention to what they are saying. Why would people spend good money to engage in such a process with another human being whose own life may be no happier than their own? The answer is that most people find it beneficial to be listened to non-judgmentally. Many benefit equally from similar [and less expensive] interactions with their hairdresser, bartender, or clergy.

To be able to focus on the expressed needs and desires of another person, reflects a generosity of spirit that is not randomly distributed in the population. It conveys a respect for the person being listened to that is unmistakable, and satisfies our deepest human longing for connectedness.

If it is true that we enter and leave this world alone, few of us can live that way for very long without going mad. People alone on desert islands do not flourish.

Little wonder then that we crave the experience of being listened to, and respond gratefully to anyone who will do this for us. We are aware at some level that the ability to listen is highly correlated with other desirable traits such as kindness, unselfishness, and empathy. The opposite is also true. The most obvious characteristic of people who are unable to listen, is a basic lack of interest in what the other person is saying, and a general lack of concern for that individual. To really listen to another is more than good manners; it is an affirmation that the person who is speaking has something to teach us.
