

KEY SHORTAGE Since our exterior locks were changed to more secure ones about 10 years ago, we have signed out 70 keys and have run out of keys again. The price from our locksmith is now \$10 each. The Facilities Ministry has decided to try a "recycle your unused key" campaign rather than purchasing more keys. The Readings

The Old Testament - Genesis 18:20-32

Then our God said, "How great is the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah and how very grave their sin! I must go down and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me; and if not, I will know."

So the travelers turned from there, and went toward Sodom, while Abraham remained standing before our God. Then Abraham came near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city; will you then sweep away the place and not forgive it for the fifty righteous who are in it? Far be it from you to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" And our God said, "If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will forgive the whole place for their sake." Abraham answered, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to our God, I who am but dust and ashes. Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking?

Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?" And God said, "I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there."

Again he spoke to him, "Suppose forty are found there." God answered, "For the sake of forty I will not do it." Then he said, "Oh do not let our God be angry if I speak. Suppose thirty are found there." God answered, "I will not do it, if I find thirty there." He said, "Let me take it upon myself to speak to our God. Suppose twenty are found there." God answered, "For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it." Then he said, "Oh do not let our God be angry if I speak just once more. Suppose ten are found there." God answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it."

The New Testament - Luke 11:1-13

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say:

Abba God, hallowed be your name. May your reign come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial."

Jesus said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, a neighbor, and you go to your neighbor at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; for friends of mine have arrived, and I have nothing to set before them.' And your neighbor answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' I tell you, even though your neighbor will not get up and give you anything out of friendship, at least because of your persistence your neighbor will get up and give you whatever you need.

"So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? If you then, with all your sins, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will our heavenly Abba give the Holy Spirit to those who ask!"

The Continuing Testament – Thomas Merton, *Thoughts in Solitude*

"My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire.

And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone."
