

JUST THE SPOKEN WORDS are amplified by our sound system into the sanctuary during our worship service. The musical offerings do not normally need amplification. However the complete worship service, including the anthems, hymns, etc., is fed to our audio-CD recorder (CDs are available in the church office for borrowing) and to the narthex speakers (for the benefit of anyone who must leave the sanctuary because of a restless child or for any other reason). Our sound operators continuously select and adjust the output from one or more of the six or seven microphones normally in use during a typical worship service to provide what they hope is optimum, seamless sound in the sanctuary as well as in the narthex and for the CD recorder. If you should use one of the portable microphones during the service, please do not turn it off but return it to its original location so that it is not eliminated from its next planned use.

HAVING TROUBLE HEARING PARTS OF THE SERVICE? Please talk to any usher about the Williams Sound - Personal PA Receiver, available for your use. These simple-to-use units can help improve your worship experience, by amplify those parts of the Service that may be more difficult to hear.

NAME TAGS are available for you to wear in the church and at coffee hour. These are helpful to visitors and new members to get to know our people. If you are missing a name tag, please let the Office know.

The Readings

The Old Testament - Amos 5:11-15

Because you trample on the poor and unfairly impose levies on their grain, you have been able to build houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them. You have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine. For I know how many are your transgressions, and how great are your sins - you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe, and push aside the needy at the gate.

Protest and rebuke seem useless in such a time; for it is an evil time. Nonetheless, I advise you to seek good and not evil, that you may live! Then the Holy One, the God of hosts, will be with you, just as you have said. Hate evil and love good, and establish justice in the gate. Then it may be, that the God of hosts will be gracious to the remaining descendants of Joseph.

The New Testament - Luke 16:19-31

Jesus said, "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table. Even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.'

But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.'

He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house - for I have five brothers - that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham; if someone goes to them from the dead, they will surely repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

Continuing Testament - from *In God We Trust: God & Money* - by David Lose [edited]

There's nothing quite like a story about a rich guy going to hell, just before the Fall Stewardship campaign kicks off, is there? Perhaps the issue isn't simply that the man is rich, or that he demonstrates no compassion toward Lazarus, but rather that his wealth prevents him from seeing or relating to Lazarus as a fellow child of God. Could it be that not having compassion is one sure sign of being lost? Even more, might Jesus be warning that riches can stunt our compassion by insulating us from the need of others?

It seems to me that part of what's at stake in Jesus' parable, is the link between our well-being and that of others.

If we cannot feel compassion for others, we have lost something that is deeply and genuinely human. In time, the wealth that has numbed us to the needs of our neighbor deludes us into imagining that we ourselves have no need, are sufficient unto ourselves, and can easily substitute hard work and a little luck for grace and mercy. At that point, we are, indeed, lost.

But I think the reverse is also true - that as we become more responsive to the hurts, hopes, and needs of others, we become more acutely aware of our own humanity, of our own longings and insufficiency. Thereby, we can appreciate God's offer of grace in Christ - the one who took-on our need, our humanity, our lot and our life, to show us God's profound love for each and all of us.


