Pastor's Ponderings

...on The Table Blessing...

"Come Lord Jesus be our guest, let this food to us be blessed."

That simple table blessing [or "grace"] conveys a profound truth. Whenever God's children invite Jesus to be present among them, everything around them takes-on a special blessing. Whether it be the food we share, the stories we tell, the way we interact - when you and I consciously acknowledge Christ's Presence, it changes the manner in which we relate to one another and to our surroundings. When I intentionally invite Jesus to be an unseen guest in my car, I tend to be a more courteous driver. When I remember to mentally acknowledge Christ's Presence in the midst of a heated argument, I'm inclined to keep a cooler head. Verbally [or even silently] asking Jesus to bless any family meal or social gathering I attend, tends to put me in a more gracious state of mind and spirit. [Maybe that's why it's called "saying grace"!]

For 200 years, some version our BUCC Family of Faith has gathered at the Communion Table to celebrate Christ's Gracious Presence. And like the varied theological interpretations of different Christian denominations, our members throughout the years have certainly had differing understandings as to how Christ's Presence is represented in the Bread and Cup that we share. Fortunately, our members have also had a healthy respect for those - and other - differences. We recognize that the blessings which freely flow from that Table of Grace are far too abundant and remarkable for any singular interpretation to define or contain. Together we simply and joyfully follow Christ's admonition to "take and eat" in remembrance and celebration of his life and love.

On the 16th of this month, many of us will gather around the table for another kind of remembrance and celebration. BUCC members and friends from the past and the present, from near and far, will congregate at Hale Farm to mark our Congregation's Bicentennial Year. This promises to be a wonderful evening of great food, stimulating conversations, plus some musical [and some amusing] treats! Rev. Dr. Rita Root, the Western Reserve and Eastern Ohio Associations' General Minister will inspire us with some words about the Church's

past, present, and future. And we will no doubt experience a sense of that past, present and future as we break bread with our longtime members and our energetic children and youth.

We have invited some special guests from our church and our community to join us at this festive gathering. And as always, we will also extend one more special invitation that evening:



The Advent tree (formerly called a Christmas tree) is a big part of our Advent/Christmas celebration here at BUCC. It is so-o-o tall, sits in the right front corner of the sanctuary and looks spectacular covered in lights. Our children hang Chrismons on it during the children's sermon on the first Sunday in Advent. It seems to appear magically BUT there is some prep work that needs to be done beforehand.

An hour +/- of labor to bring the tree and accessories down from the attic and set it all up on the Saturday before Advent is the first job. The second job is another hour +/- the week after Christmas to take the tree and decorations down, pack them and return to attic. So it only takes about 4 hours of your time during the holiday season to handle the job along with recruited volunteers.



Over the years this job has been passed down to younger and more able members of our congregation and it is time again to pass the "torch". It won't seem like Christmas without the tree, the wreaths and other decorations, so we are asking for volunteers to take over the job of decorating our church for the holidays.
