

The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 103:1-12

Bless the Holy One, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless God's holy name. Bless the Holy One, O my soul, and do not forget all God's benefits:

Who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases, Who redeems your life from the Pit, who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy, Who satisfies you with good as long as you live, so that your strength is renewed like the eagle's.

The Holy One works vindication and justice for all who are oppressed. God made known to Moses the way of compassion, through acts of kindness to the people of Israel. The Holy One is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. God will not always accuse, nor keep angry forever. God does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is God's steadfast love toward those who show God reverence; as far as the east is from the west, so far is the distance that God removes our transgressions from us.

The New Testament - Luke 19:1-10

Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through it. A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him, because Jesus was going to pass that way. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him.

All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." Zacchaeus said to Jesus, "Look, half of my possessions, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man is also a son of Abraham and Sarah. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."
