JUST THE SPOKEN WORDS are amplified by our sound system into the sanctuary during our worship service. The musical offerings do not normally need amplification. However the complete worship service, including the anthems, hymns, etc., is fed to our audio-CD recorder (CDs are available in the church office for borrowing) and to the narthex speakers (for the benefit of anyone who must leave the sanctuary because of a restless child or for any other reason). Our sound operators continuously select and adjust the output from one or more of the six or seven microphones normally in use during a typical worship service to provide what they hope is optimum, seamless sound in the sanctuary as well as in the narthex and for the CD recorder. If you should use one of the portable microphones during the service, please do not turn it off but return it to its original location so that it is not eliminated from its next planned use.

NAME TAGS are available for you to wear in the church and at coffee hour. These are helpful to visitors and new members to get to know our people. If you are missing a name tag, please let the Office know.

Readings

The Old Testament - Jeremiah 23:1-6

Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Holy One. Therefore thus says the Holy One, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Holy One. Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply.

I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing. The days are surely coming, declares the Holy One, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness."

The New Testament - Luke 23:33-43

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "God, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, God's chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who was hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

The Continuing Testament - from *Christ the King* - by William Loader [edited]

From the beginning, the Gospel writer Luke presents Jesus as one who is addressing Israel's hopes of liberation. The songs of the birth narratives are full of it. Jesus marches into his hometown synagogue to announce good news to the poor, the oppressed and the afflicted. He asserts and expresses the value of those considered valueless. He gathers people and announces change. He is not beginning a school of meditation for personal enrichment [though that will have its place]; nor is he promising a utopia at another time and place. Rather he is announcing change, and embodying it in himself and in his community. Is that dangerous? Well, it's certainly not harmless for those with a vested interest in the status quo. The Realm which Jesus envisions and advocates for, will certainly shake and challenge the realms of this world.

To affirm that Jesus is king, however, is to affirm a different kind of kingship - though not a kingship which abdicates to an inner or other world. Jesus didn't come to create a set of doormats, but to spread a revolution of love and grace.

The power of Christ's Passion is not to be dissolved by dislocation - by saying Christ's concerns lie elsewhere, beyond this world. It is rather a power to be reckoned with in the here and now. Asserting Christ the King as a counter image - is a powerfully subversive declaration, particularly in the midst of the cruelty and corruption which keeps poor people poor.
