# The Readings

#### The Old Testament - Genesis 18:1-8

The Holy One appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on - since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

#### The New Testament - Romans 15:5-7

May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and source of our Lord Jesus Christ. Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

**The Continuing Testament** - from *Process Theology in the United Church of Christ* - by David M. Stowe [edited]

The most fundamental affirmation of the Bible is that God is a "living God." Any concordance will show how often that very expression is used. The Bible characteristically refers to God as acting, working, loving, judging, feeling, willing, planning, even suffering - all the earmarks of life as we experience it.

Surprisingly, many theologians have not taken this biblical testimony very seriously. They have been more interested in proclaiming something absolutely fixed and unchanging at the heart of the universe than in the live-liness of God.

At the center of some classical theologies, one discovers a God who is unmoving, eternally unchanging both in being and in decree - a fixed stillness...like death itself.

The living God is no remote Ruler in the heavens, but a creative Spirit intimately involved with every last part of the creation. Hence...the living God is deeply concerned about relationships - God's relationships with the world and relationships within God's world, especially relationships of human beings with each other and with the natural world around them.
