

The Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Holy One, hear my prayers! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! If you, O God, should mark iniquities, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered. I wait for the Holy One, my soul waits, and in God's word I hope. My soul waits for the Holy One more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the dawn. O Israel, hope in the Holy One! For with the Holy One there is steadfast love, and great power to redeem. It is the Holy One who will redeem Israel from all iniquities.

The New Testament - from John Chapter 11

Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha....So the sisters sent a message to Jesus, "Rabbi, he whom you love is ill."....Though Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, after having heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was. Then after this he said to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea again." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jewish authorities were just now trying to stone you, and are you going there again?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Those who walk during the day do not stumble, because they see the light of this world...."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, some two miles away, and many had come to Martha and Mary to console them about their brother.

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary stayed at home. Martha said to him, "Jesus, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Chosen One of God, the One coming into the world." When she had said this, she went back and called her sister Mary, and told her privately, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you." And when she heard it, she got up quickly and went to him....When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Jesus, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping, and those who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Come and see." Jesus wept. So they said, "See how much he loved him!" But others said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind have kept this man from dying?" Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha said to him, "there is already a stench, because he has been dead four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and said, "My Heavenly Parent, I thank you for having heard me. I know that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go." Many therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

The Continuing Testament - from Lazarus Is Us! - by Alyce McKenzie [edited]

The Fourth Gospel repeatedly uses the physical realm as a metaphorical pointer to the spiritual realm. Water is a metaphor for the quenching of our spiritual thirst through Jesus' presence; Jesus is the Living Water. The bread Jesus multiplies to feed the crowd is a metaphor for the satisfaction of our spiritual hunger that Jesus brings; Jesus is the Bread from Heaven. Sight is a metaphor for the spiritual vision and clarity that Jesus brings; Jesus is the Light of the World. The restoration of physical life to Lazarus is a metaphor for breaking-free from the bonds of spiritual death, leading into the gift of eternal life that Jesus brings. Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life.

Lazarus is the "one Jesus loves". He represents *all* those whom Jesus loves, which includes you and me and all of humankind. This story, then, is the story of our coming to life from death in this present moment, not just in a future event. The epiphany is that we are to see ourselves in Lazarus and see the miracle of his restoration of physical life as the beginning of our entry into eternal life, which begins the moment we accept Jesus' offer of a life-giving relationship with us.
