

Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

The New Testament - John 10.1-5; 11-16

Jesus says, "Truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers....

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away - and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as my Heavenly Parent and I deeply know one another. And I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must also bring them in, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

The Continuing Testament - from *How to Love Like a Mother* - by Anne Sutherland Howard [edited]

I am not a shepherd, so the best way I know how to describe the work of a shepherd, is as a mother. I believe that what we need in our churches and our schools and our homes and our public squares is a kind of love that looks something like a mother's love. The kind of love that - like a shepherd's - is both tender, and fierce....

It means paying attention, knowing what time it is and what the weather's like out there. It means naming danger when it threatens, and meeting it with savvy and with courage. It means teaching the difference between right and wrong. It means being responsible for our words and our actions, and calling on others - like public officials who block common sense gun laws - to take responsibility for their actions.

It means showing up, being present, caring, not expecting somebody else to handle it. It means having a strong sense of identity and belonging, coupled with a profound respect and appreciation for others. It means compassion, knowing that we are all in this together. And of course it means getting your heart broken, which opens you to hold the pain - as well as the beauty - of being fully human.
