



OUR HYMN OF THE MONTH for July is, *Out of the Depths, O God We Call* written by Ruth C. Duck. This hymn reminds us that as we deal with Life's past wounds, or face our future fears, we are not alone. We are blessed and strengthened by a gracious and caring community of faith. In and through this community we are touched, healed and held by the Holy One. Remembering this and trusting it, is certainly a tremendous benefit in today's disjointed and distressing world.

Ruth Duck is professor of worship at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, and an ordained pastor of the United Church of Christ. In addition to teaching and writing hymns, Ruth also is involved with ministry through the arts in worship - including music, movement, and visual arts.

If you find a particular hymn with words that move you, please let Pastor Dave or Dave Debick know, and we will try to use it as a future Hymn of the Month.

THE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP is reading EVERYONE BRAVE IS FORGIVEN by Chris Cleve, which is set in 1939 London when most of the city's children are evacuated except the mentally impaired, disabled or black. A totally inexperienced teacher is assigned these children as her first teaching experience. The book has been praised for its "ability to stay small and quiet against the raging tableau of war." This discussion begins at 1:00 in the parlor, August 7. All are welcome.

Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 139:1-12

O Holy One, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, O Holy One, you know it completely. You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.

Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there; if I make my bed in the Underworld, you are there. If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast. If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night," even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you.

The New Testament - Matthew 13:24-30

Jesus presented them another parable: "The Realm of God may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field; but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. And the servants of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn."

The Continuing Testament - from *Tangled Humanity* - by Christopher Burkett [edited]

It's so easy to see ourselves as 'wheat' and other people as 'weeds.' So easy to point the finger; to paint others in the worst light; to label and judge. When relationship troubles happen we easily put it down to some deeply ingrained personality characteristic in the other person. He's the terrible driver because he won't concentrate properly; she's the spiteful one because she can't resist sounding off without thinking. We excuse ourselves because of the pressure of circumstances, but we condemn others for deep-rooted flaws in their very selves. That what the psychologists call Fundamental Attribution Error - attributing other people's behavior to the way they *are*, rather than to the circumstances in which they are set. It's so easy to see the world in stark terms - us and them, the good and the bad, the kindly and the cruel, the wheat and the weeds

So where is the evil located? Is it to be found in a far away, or maybe not so far away, enemy who has sown evil into my life - weeds that are all around me? Must I just bear with those weeds, endure them, until such time as I am harvested into heaven, and they are destroyed, as pernicious weeds should be? In this view, the wheat is all in me, or my group, or my church, or whatever; and the weeds are 'out there.'

Our inclination is to divide the world sharply into wheat and weeds, saints and sinners. But Christ's parable suggests something else that speaks to the complexity of the human character. So look at what God sees: a reality as it is, rather than as what we construct by our prejudices and particular outlook. It's hard to tell wheat from weeds - that's the problem! We may not be the best judge of what is 'good' or 'evil' - either in ourselves or in others. So we best leave the judgment up to God.
