





JUST THE SPOKEN WORDS are amplified by our sound system into the sanctuary during our worship service. The musical offerings do not normally need amplification. However the complete worship service, including the anthems, hymns, etc., is fed to our audio-CD recorder (CDs are available in the church office for borrowing) and to the narthex speakers (for the benefit of anyone who must leave the sanctuary because of a restless child or for any other reason).

Our sound operators continuously select and adjust the output from one or more of the six or seven microphones normally in use during a typical worship service to provide what they hope is optimum, seamless sound in the sanctuary as well as in the narthex and for the CD recorder. If you should use one of the portable microphones during the service, please do not turn it off but return it to its original location so that it is not eliminated from its next planned use.

NAME TAGS are available for you to wear in the church and at coffee hour. These are helpful to visitors and new members to get to know our people. If you are missing a name tag, please let the Office know.

THE BLESSINGS JAR is for your use to drop in a note and/or money in response to a special blessing you have received during the week. We would like to recognize your blessing in the Pillar if you wish.

THE PEACE CANDLE is placed up front every Sunday to remind us of Jesus' teachings on peace and peacemakers. We pray that peace between nations, within our country, community, families, and ourselves will become a priority for all.

The Old Testament - Psalm 100

The New Testament - Matthew 11:16-19; 28-30

Jesus says," To what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to one another, 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not mourn.' For John the Baptist came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon'; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds."

The Continuing Testament - from *Amazing Grace* - by Kathleen Norris [edited]

I have come to suspect that when people complain about "organized" religion, what they are really saying is that they can't stand other people. At least not enough to trust them to help work out a "personal" spirituality. How can they possibly trust these unknown others, people with whom they may have little in common, to help them along on their religious journey?

Joining a church is not like joining a hobby club; you will find all sorts of people there, not all of whom will share your interests, let alone your opinions. But there is a vast difference between the giant abstraction called "Organized Religion" and religion as people actually live it. Many Roman Catholics seem to thrive in the tension that exists between the fussy structure of the church hierarchy and the faith as it is lived.

In the rural area where I live, churches are the only institution capable of sustaining community ministries such as a food pantry and a domestic violence hot line. But they provide something more, that even the most well-intentioned "social services" cannot replace. It is called *salvation*, but it begins small, at the local level, in a church that provides a time and space for people to gather to meet a Holy, Unifying Presence who has promised to be there with them and within them!
