

Sacrament of Holy Baptism

L: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism bears witness to the Divine Love and Grace that is extended to each of us at every stage of our lives.

P: Today we celebrate God's love for this child, and offer ourselves as instruments of that love in her life.

L: When parents brought their children to Jesus so that he might touch them, his disciples rebuked them; but when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them,

P: "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the Realm of God.

L:Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the Realm of God like a little child, shall not enter it."

P: Then Jesus took the children into his arms and blessed them, laying his hands upon them.

L: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is an outward and visible sign of Divine Grace. Because the promise of the Gospel is not only to us, but also to our children, baptism with water and the Holy Spirit is the mark of their acceptance into the care of Christ's Church, the sign and seal of their participation in God's forgiveness, and the beginning of their growth into full Christian faith.

P: Out of the Water of Holy Baptism, we rise with new life, forgiveness and grace as members of the One Body of Christ.

Promises of the parents and Godparents

Pastor: Do you desire to have your child baptized into the faith and family of Jesus Christ?

Pastor: Will you encourage her to resist the power of evil, and to receive the freedom of new life in Christ?

OUR HYMN OF THE MONTH for June is *Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness*, written by James K. Manley. Manley was born in 1940 at Holyoke, Massachusetts, and received his education at Whittier College, Pacific School of Religion, and Claremont School of Theology. He was ordained to the ministry of the United Church of Christ in 1966. Manley "felt the urging of the Holy Spirit to write this hymn" after he had completed the rough draft of his Doctor of Ministry thesis. A new arrangement was created for *The New Century Hymnal* in 1995.

As we move into our long Church Season of Pentecost, this hymn serves as a good reminder of the many ways in which the Spirit has moved - and continues to work - through the lives of God's people. If you find a particular hymn with words that move you, please let Pastor Dave or Dave Debick know, and we will try to use it as a future Hymn of the Month.

Readings

The Old Testament - Exodus 3:11-15

Moses said to the Holy One, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" The Holy One said, "I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship me on this mountain." But Moses said, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is God's name?' what shall I say to them?" The Holy One said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM.! Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I AM has sent me to you.' "The Holy One also said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'The Holy One, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you': This is my name forever, and this my title for all generations."

The New Testament - Matthew 9:35-10:4

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the Divine Realm, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the ruler of the harvest to send out laborers into the harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

The Continuing Testament - from *The Call of Moses* - by Larry Broding [edited]

The Hebrews believed that the name of something or someone revealed the power of the thing or individual; to know one's source of power meant having power over that person. So, when Moses asks for God's name, he not only asks for a revelation into God, he seeks power over God. However, when he received God's name, it is Moses who is changed. The dialogue between God and Moses ends, and the mission of Moses begins. God changes Moses through the power of the name; Moses does not change God.

Many times when we try to change God's will through prayer, we become frustrated. No wonder! Like Moses we seek God's power, only to find we are not in charge. God changes us, we do not and cannot change God. Like Moses, God changes us by calling us by name, and by challenging us to do God's will of setting people free.
