

Sacrament of Holy Baptism

L: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism bears witness to the Divine Love and Grace that is extended to each of us at every stage of our lives.

P: Today we celebrate God's love for this child, and offer ourselves as instruments of that love in his life.

L: When parents brought their children to Jesus so that he might touch them, his disciples rebuked them; but when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them,

P: "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the Realm of God.

L:Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the Realm of God like a little child, shall not enter it."

P: Then Jesus took the children into his arms and blessed them, laying his hands upon them.

L: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is an outward and visible sign of Divine Grace. Because the promise of the Gospel is not only to us, but also to our children, baptism with water and the Holy Spirit is the mark of their acceptance into the care of Christ's Church, the sign and seal of their participation in God's forgiveness, and the beginning of their growth into full Christian faith.

P: Out of the Water of Holy Baptism, we rise with new life, forgiveness and grace as members of the One Body of Christ.

Promises of the Parents

Pastor: Do you desire to have your child baptized into the faith and family of Jesus Christ?

Parents: We do.

Pastor: Will you encourage him to resist the power of evil, and to receive the freedom of new life in Christ?

Parents: We will, with the help of God.

Pastor: Will you teach and nurture him that he may be inspired to know and follow Jesus

Christ?

Parents: We will, with the help of God.

Pastor: Do you promise to grow with him in the Christian faith and to help him be a faithful member of the Church - by modeling Christ's Compassion in your lives, by furthering Christ's mission in the world, and by offering him the on-going nurture of the Church? Parents: We do, with the help of God.

He has a Master of Divinity Degree from Pacific School of Religion, and is an ordained Elder in the United Methodist Church. According to Damon, what he seeks to do with today's hymn, and with each hymn he composes is "To keep things simple and singable, while at the same time exploring the edges of our spoken and sung faith."

Readings

The New Testament Letter - Romans 13:7-10

Saint Paul writes, Pay to all what is due them - taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due. Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves others has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet" - and any other commandment - are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the Law.

The New Testament Gospel - Matthew 22:15-22

Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap Jesus in what he said. So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their cunning malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the tax." And they handed him a denarius. Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard this, they were dumbfounded; and they left him and went away.

The Continuing Testament - from *Paying Taxes to Caesar* - by Edward Markquart [edited]

Throughout the centuries, Christians generally have honored governmental authority. We know that human beings need a governing institution in order for humane society to occur. A society cannot function without some form of civic authority. We also realize that at times, there is an insidious temptation for people to worship their government; and sometimes to give the government a kind of blind obedience. Yet governments - like churches - are always in need of scrutiny and evaluation, reformation and positive change.

Christians can, and should, work for progress and favorable changes - both in their faith communities and in the political systems under which they live. One important aspect of this that we must always keep in mind, however, is that we do not worship the governing authority; we worship the Holy One who is revealed in Jesus Christ. We may show our governments respect; but it is the Holy One to whom we owe our reverence and our ultimate allegiance.
