According to Damon, what he seeks to do with today's hymn, and with each hymn he composes is "To keep things simple and singable, while at the same time exploring the edges of our spoken and sung faith."

The Obertones are a men's *a cappella* choral ensemble that performs a broad range of current musical styles, including pop, alternative, R & B, and classic rock. THE PEACE CANDLE is placed up front every Sunday to remind us of Jesus' teachings on peace and peacemakers. We pray that peace between nations, within our country, community, families, and ourselves will become a priority for all.

OUR COMPLETE WORSHIP SERVICE, including anthems, hymns, etc., is fed by our sound system to our new audio-CD recorder (CDs are available in the church office for borrowing) and to the narthex speakers (for the benefit of anyone who must leave the sanctuary because of a restless child or for any other reason). If you should use one of the portable microphones during the service, please do not turn it off but return it to its location so that its continuing feed is not eliminated from the system.

BUCC HAS THE LATEST, up-to-date version of the Williams personal sound system. It may just be your answer if you are concerned (1) that the quality of sound deteriorates between the speakers and your pew in the sanctuary, or (2) that your hearing is getting poorer but not yet bad enough to buy hearing aids, or (3) that you have hearing aids and you want to hear even better or (4) that you are bothered by the route 82 traffic noises or any noise generated by your pew mates during worship.

Receivers are available in the narthex for you to borrow which pick up ALL PARTS of the worship service - sermon, readings, choir and organ music, etc. Just plug in one of our head phones, your favorite Walkman head phones or any other unit with a 3.5mm plug and you are ready for a new hearing experience. Don't know if you want to do this? Then try it out; borrow one of the church's head phones and "test drive" a Williams receiver during a worship service.

And if you already have digital hearing aids, an even better experience awaits you. Simply have your audiologist activate the teleloop option of you hearing aids, borrow a receiver with a teleloop plugged in and experience sound quality you never would have expected. The sound remains electronic all the way from the speaker's mic to your ear drum.

One of our ushers and members of the Spiritual Life Ministry are ready to help you get started. Check with them before the service next Sunday. Your questions are gladly answered.

Readings

The Old Testament - Micah 4:1-4

In days to come the mountain of the Holy One shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised-up above the hills. Peoples shall stream to it, and many nations shall come and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Holy One, to the house of the God of Jacob; who may teach us the Holy One's ways, that we may walk in righteous paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction and the word of the Holy One from Jerusalem. The Holy One shall judge between many peoples, and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away. They shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid. For the mouth of the Holy One has spoken.

The New Testament - Romans 12:9-21

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are.

Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

The Continuing Testament - Personal Reflections - by Bill Toneff [edited]

During World War II, I hated the Germans. I was in the 3rd Armored Division and we "liberated" a concentration camp. The sight of those half-dead slave-workers showed how bad Hitler and Nazi Germany were. I hated the Japanese. Most Americans hated them more than they hated the Germans, because of Pearl Harbor and other atrocities. But after the war, my faith and my intelligence took over, and my hate floated away, as it did for most Americans....

....Have you ever hated a boss, an employee, a coworker, an in-law, sibling or spouse? Think of the people who enjoy hating and enjoy telling how and why they hate Blacks or Jews, their boss or neighbor. Think of the volume of hate on the internet's social media. We all must realize that hatred leads to meanness, cruelty, murder and war. It is evil; it is sinful

Jesus says "love your enemies". Yet this is very, very hard to do. So, while getting angry is both human and okay, we must all try hard to not let that anger turn to hate. When it does, we must let that hate float-away. We have to stop hating first, before we can ever start loving.
