OUR "HYMN OF THE MONTH" for September is *Now Let Us All, in Hymns of Praise*, by Fred Pratt Green. Green was born in Liverpool, England, in 1903, and ordained into the British Methodist ministry. He served as a pastor and district superintendent in Brighton and York. Throughout his ministry, Green tried to write new hymns "that could fill the gap between the hymns of the first part of this century and the 'far-out' compositions that have crowded into some churches in the last decade or more." ▶

Today's hymn reflects Green's understanding of how the Church must continue to find relevance in each generation, and not simply rest on past achievements:

What changes, challenges, and tests the church of Christ survives....
Still must the church proclaim to all that now, and evermore,
the house of God is open house, and Christ the Open Door.

Readings

The Old Testament - Numbers 11:16-17; 24-29

The Holy One said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place there with you. I will come down and talk with you there; and I will take some of the spirit that is on you and put it on them; and they shall bear the burden of the people along with you so that you will not bear it all by yourself.... So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Holy One; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. Then the Holy One came down in the cloud and spoke to Moses, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied.

Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen, said, "My lord Moses, stop them!" But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all of God's people be prophets, and that the Holy One's spirit would be placed upon them all!"

The New Testament - Luke 10:1-11

After this Jesus appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the ruler of the harvest to send out laborers into the harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house.

Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; heal the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The Divine Realm has come near to you.' But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the Divine Realm has come near.'

The Continuing Testament - from *A Portrait of Jesus* - by Joseph Grizone [edited]

When you go through the Gospels, you begin to see that Jesus did exercise authority, but it was a unique kind of authority. He had authority over demons and over people's illnesses. He healed, he consoled, he comforted, he raised the dead to life, he gave sight to the blind. But most of all he taught with authority, not by threatening and doing violence to people's minds, but by the power of his word he made the truth as clear as humanly possible. What he did most of all, was teach by the beauty of his own life and example.

That was the kind of authority Jesus had in mind for his apostles - a gentle, kind authority that persuaded by the inherent power of the message itself. As powerful as Jesus was, he never bullied or used oppressive tactics to force people into submission. How beautiful and attractive Christianity would be if Christian leaders imitated Jesus' humility, gentleness, and courtesy in the exercise of their authority.
