

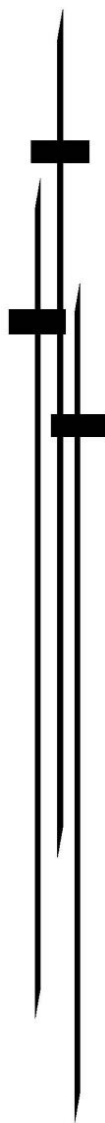

## ***Pastor's Ponderings***

### ***...on Growing Together...***

When considering the subject of Church growth, there are three primary areas to consider. The first is *personal* growth: the ways in which an individual Church member's own faith and understanding, commitment and participation develops and increases. The second is *relational* growth; the ways that members within the Church strengthen their ties with each other, and their ability to work together in carrying-forward the Church's mission. The third is *collective* growth: the literal increase in Church membership, as the community of Faith draws others into its fold.

On Saturday October 14<sup>th</sup> from 10:30 am - 4:00 pm, BUCC members and friends - adults and teens - will gather for our annual Retreat at the Hinckley Reservation. This year's theme will be "Growing in our Faith", which will touch on those three areas of church growth mentioned above, and which should dovetail nicely with the work of this year's Welcome & Growth Task-force. We will look at, and re-image, some classic Bible stories about growth and productivity, abundance and generosity. We'll also share some stories about times in our own lives when we've experienced personal growth, the generosity of others, or a sense of Divine Abundance and Blessing. And we'll spend some time talking about some of the ways we can grow together as a community of Faith.

As an added bonus, we will hear some stories about *literal* growth - as Anne Melfo shares some of the exciting things that are happening with the *Cleveland Roots* program. This is the West-side Cleveland project that she and Doug Fawcett and their children Victor and Mickey have launched.

Along with our planned activities, we will also share a noon meal together, and take some time to simply get to know one another a bit better. Spending a day together in a relaxed and beautiful setting presents a great opportunity for doing this! ►

## NEWS FROM OCWM

The last hunger meal served was on Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup> at Pearl Road United Methodist Church. Due to a PRUMC service that precluded us from using the kitchen until 4PM, and the hungry folks arrive at 5 PM, the menu was shortened to sandwiches to be taken out instead of being eaten at the church. So the BUCC troopers arrived at 4 and prepared about 150 sandwiches before 4:45 PM! The ham and cheese, turkey and cheese, salami, and especially the egg salad sandwiches were well received. The egg salad was donated, which was very much appreciated. About 80 to 100 people were served, and there were leftovers, which were taken to St. Herman's. The BUCC bakers did their usual good job, and we couldn't do without them. The next hunger meal is scheduled for Sunday, November 26<sup>th</sup> at Pearl Road United Methodist Church. The usual sign-up board will be posted in the narthex for those interested in joining in preparing and serving nutrition to those in need.



The next designated offering will be received on Sunday, October 1, 2017. The funds will be used for the Neighbors In Need effort. Elsewhere in this pillar, and in Sunday bulletins will be interpretive information as to the uses to which this offering will be put.

### NEIGHBORS IN NEED (NIN) OFFERING, OCTOBER 1, 2017

**Neighbors in Need (NIN)** is a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States.

The 2017 theme for the NIN offering is "Protect the Sacred: In a Just World, Clean Water is Life."

One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). The Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM) is the voice for American Indian people in the UCC. CAIM provides Christian ministry and witness to American Indians and to the wider church. Justice issues that affect American Indian life are communicated to the whole UCC by CAIM.

Historically, the forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. CAIM supports these local churches and their pastors. In addition, CAIM strives to be a resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations and to strengthen their participation in the life of the church.

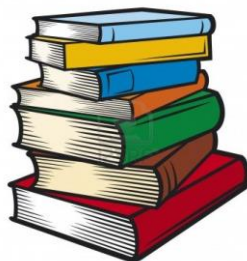
Two-thirds of the NIN offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries(JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. Funding is provided through donations to the Neighbors in Need offering.

We will receive the NIN offering on **October 1, 2017** as part of World Communion Sunday observance. Neighbors in Need helps make another world possible. It needs your support. Please give generously. Thank you.

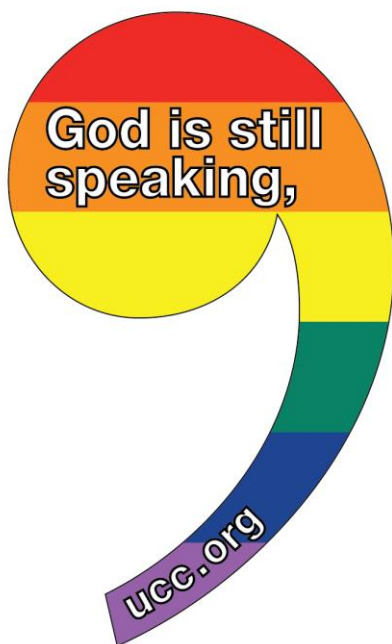
