





Readings

The Old Testament - Deuteronomy 8:11-18

Moses said to the people of Israel, "Take care that you do not forget the Holy One, by failing to keep God's commandments, ordinances, and statutes, which I am commanding you today. When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Holy One who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. God made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good.

Do not say to yourself, 'My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth.' But remember the Holy One, for it is God who gives you power to get wealth, so that God may confirm the covenant sworn to your ancestors, as God is doing today.

The New Testament - Matthew 9:35-10:1; 5-8

Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the Divine Realm, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the ruler of the harvest to send out laborers into the harvest."

.....These twelve Jesus sent out, and commanded them, saying, "Do not go among the Gentiles, and do not enter any city of the Samaritans. But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, preach, saying, 'The Realm of the Holy One is at hand.' Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, and cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give."

The Continuing Testament - from Freely You Are to Give

Christian charity demands we recognize Life is more than the barest of needs....If we want to know how we are to give, we look at Jesus. He made five loaves and two fish feed five thousand people. He made six giant jars of wine for a wedding feast. Divine Love is lavish; ours should be too. Caring for the poor is something we're all called to do, whether through direct ministry or charitable donations. It's a necessary manifestation of our Faith. We are reminded over and over again, 'whatever we do to the least of these, our sisters and brothers, we do unto Christ.' Therefore, we must not simply know *about* the poor, but *know* the poor; not merely care about poverty, but seek to alleviate suffering by being a source of generosity and hope, compassion and friendship.

None of us merit Divine kindness, therefore all of us can freely share with others the Divine kindness that we ourselves have freely received. And we have been given the greatest kindness possible, gifted to us through Jesus Christ. Any generosity we offer, is a pale imitation of Christ's love. And we should remember that we're not only helping others by our generosity, but also ourselves. Because the more we give, the more Christ-like we become. In this regard, service to the poor is not charity. All we have, is a gift. We are merely "giving it forward". Real charity is simply an invitation for you and me to be more Christ-like.
