The Old Testament - Psalm 145:1-9

I will extol you, my Source and Sovereign, and bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you, and praise your name forever and ever. Great is the Holy One, and greatly to be praised; the Holy One's greatness is unsearchable. One generation shall laud your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.

On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate. The might of your awesome deeds shall be proclaimed, and I will declare your greatness. They shall celebrate the fame of your abundant goodness, and shall sing aloud of your righteousness. The Holy One is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Holy One is good to all, and shows compassion for all of Creation.

The New Testament - Matthew 25:14-29

Jesus says "The Divine Realm is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. The one who had received the five talents went off at once and traded with them, and made five more talents. In the same way, the one who had the two talents made two more talents. But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. After a long time the master came and settled accounts with them.

The one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.'

Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy servant! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. \blacktriangleright

For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless servant, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' "

The Continuing Testament - from *Transcend Your Limits* - by Stefan Zugor [edited]

In Life you'll always find that it seems to be the things you don't do that you regret. What do I mean by this? Well, think about all of the chances you've had in your life. All the times when you've had an opportunity. Think about, for example, your last holiday. There were probably opportunities to do some things you wouldn't usually be able to do. Things like unique excursions which you wouldn't find anywhere else. Did you do those things? If you did, well done. If not, you probably find yourself looking back and wishing you did.

It's always this way because, in Life, we have a short period of time to fill with experiences and memories. If we don't take the opportunity when it's there, or we decline certain things, we look back on it and say things like: "I wish I'd given it a go!" or the classic line: "If I knew then what I know now...." And I'm not just talking about major things. Often it's the small stuff - like taking the opportunity to go on an outing with your family, or going for a walk with an old friend - that we most regret not doing. They might seem like little things at the time, yet often they're things that matter the most.
