Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 85:8-13

Let me hear what the Holy One has to say, for the Holy One will speak peace to those who are faithful, to those who turn to God in their hearts. Surely Divine salvation is at hand for those who reverence the Holy One, that Divine glory may dwell in our land.

Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other. Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky.
