LET THEM EAT CAKE....PLEASE! This Tuesday, December 5th, the U.S. Supreme Court will hear *Masterpiece Cakeshop v. Colorado Civil Rights Commission*, a case involving the Colorado bakery that violated a non-discrimination law by refusing to sell a cake to a same-sex couple celebrating their marriage. The question before the Supreme Court is whether religious beliefs give business owners a right to discriminate against LGBTQ people *and others!* While we may firmly agree that freedom of religion is one of our most fundamental rights, it gives no one the right to discriminate against others. Please pray that the Court will take a stand for the equal rights of all citizens.

Readings

The Old Testament - Isaiah 40:1-5

Comfort, O comfort my people, says the Holy One. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Holy One's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

The New Testament - Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to John, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

The Continuing Testament - from *Repent and Believe in The Gospel!* - by Susan Thistlethwaite [edited]

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German pastor who was arrested and ultimately executed by the Nazis for his opposition to Hitler, contrasted what he called "cheap grace" with the costly grace of the Gospel. The Christianity Bonhoeffer denounced is the Christianity that must be denounced today. It is a Christianity that literally enables hate: hate for people of color, for immigrants, for those of other religions, for gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender human beings, for women and girls, for the poor and the most vulnerable among us.

And why do these so-called Christians do this? Not out of obedience to the teachings of Jesus, because Jesus taught the exact opposite of their hatemongering. No, they do it for power, for political gain. Jesus asks, "What does it profit you to gain the whole world and lose your soul?" [Mark 8:36]

The most important thing we can do as Christians is announce the good news of the Gospel. The good news is the radical inclusivity of God, for "God so loved the world!" Not just some in the world who are white, or rich, or male or heterosexual. God loved the whole world of animals and plants and the entire ecosystem that is a victim of this same voraciousness and nearly mindless drive for domination. The good news, and it is very good news, is an invitation to turn away from greed and turn toward love of neighbor. To turn away from hate, and turn towards love.
