



Readings

The Old Testament - Jeremiah 31:31-34

The days are surely coming, says the Holy One, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt - a covenant that they broke, though I was like a spouse to them. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Holy One: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Holy One," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

The New Testament - John 12:20-33

Now among those who went up to worship at the Passover festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified! Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Holy One will honor."

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say, 'God, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Holy One, glorify your name!" Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

The Continuing Testament - from Solomon's Success - by Kenneth Samuel [edited]

I believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal personification and embodiment of universal love, and I believe that Jesus was crucified at Calvary precisely because he refused to limit God's love to any one class, nation, or religious persuasion. It is precisely because Jesus manifested the love of God to persons outside his religious tradition that he was killed by the traditionalists of his own religion.

In his resurrection, however, Jesus demonstrated that he would not be constrained by religious convention, nor confined by cultural exclusivism. He arose from the dead as Savior, Redeemer, and Reconciler of the whole wide world. Absolutely no one lives outside the purview of Christ's grace, love, and mercy. No religion can contain him; no cultural expression can exhaust him; no nation can confine him; and no grave can keep him from advancing the all inclusive love of Almighty God for all humankind.
