Readings

The Old Testament - Deuteronomy 10:12-13; 17-19

Moses said "So now, O Israel, what does the Holy One require of you? Only to revere the Holy One, to walk in all God's ways, to love God, and to serve the Holy One with all your heart and with all your soul, and to keep the commandments and decrees of your God that I am commanding you today, for your own well-being.... For the Holy One is mighty and awesome, not partial and takes no bribe. The Holy One executes justice for the orphan and the widow, and loves the strangers, providing them food and clothing. You shall also love the stranger, for you yourselves were strangers in the land of Egypt."

The New Testament - John 14:23-29

Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Heavenly Parent will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Divine Source who sent me.

"I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Holy One will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the my Heavenly Parent, because my Parent is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.
