Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 138

I give you thanks, O Holy One, with my whole heart; I sing your praise! I bow down toward your Holy Temple and give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and faithfulness; for you have exalted your name and your word above everything. On the day I called, you answered me, you increased my strength of soul.

All the rulers of the earth shall praise you, O Holy One, for they have heard the words of your mouth. They shall sing of your ways, for great is your glory. For though you are high and exalted, you lovingly regard the lowly; but the haughty and proud, you perceives from far away.

Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve me against the wrath of my enemies; you stretch out your hand, and your right hand delivers me. The Holy One's purpose is fulfilled in me; your steadfast love, O Gracious One, endures forever. Do not forsake the work of your hands!

The New Testament - Mark 3:20-35

The crowd gathered around Jesus again, so that he and his disciples could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." So Jesus confronted them, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? A kingdom divided against itself cannot stand. And a house divided against itself cannot stand. If Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come.... Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never find forgiveness, but is guilty of an enduring sin" [for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit!"]

Then Jesus' mother and brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. The crowd around him said, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." Jesus replied, "Who are my mother, my brothers, and my sisters?" And looking at those around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of the Holy One is my brother and sister and mother."

The Continuing Testament - from *Ministry that Gets Us in Trouble* - by Patrick Johnson [edited]

Jesus' ministry was full of grace and power and difficult truth-telling that unsettled the status quo and made religious leaders and Jesus' family uncomfortable. For the crowds Jesus was literally a God-send: healing their diseases, casting out demons that kept people in mental, emotional, and social bondage, and challenging false and self-serving religion and religious leaders. Jesus defines his family as anyone who does the will of God. Many churches consider themselves "like one big family." In its best sense, this means that everyone knows one another, they share a common history and common values, they care for one another. In its worst sense, it means that there's a lot of drama, and only people "like us" are welcome.▶

Jesus redefines his family as open-ended and dynamic, and radically different from our typical understanding of family. The brothers and sisters of Jesus are defined by action and intention, not birth or long relationships. They are defined by doing of the will of God; and that family includes anyone who wants to bend, or be bent, toward the will of God. To understand Jesus' family like this might at first be unsettling to us who are comfortable in the family as we know it. But when we embrace Jesus' dynamic family structure, we might discover we have many wonderful and beautiful sisters and brothers we never knew we had!
