

## *Pastor's Ponderings*

### ***...on the Struggles of Change...***

Barbara Holmes is president and professor of ethics and African American Religious Studies at United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities. In her book *Joy Unspeakable*, she writes about how important it is that today's Church leaders find new and creative ways to envision and express the message and mission of Jesus Christ. I completely agree! This notion is one of the reasons I've been excited about our Welcome & Growth Task-force. I recognize that the up-and-coming generation communicates, relates, and experiences Life in ways that are different than what I myself have known. And I'd like to think that I am perfectly O.K. with change, especially for the sake of conveying Christ's message to others. However, Holmes raises a point in her book that makes me realize that I probably have some work to do, if I am truly going to be an instrument of change and growth in the Church. She writes:

"To reconsider your circumstances using the perspectives of a new generation is a difficult and contemplative act. It is contemplative because it requires the recognition that the world as we know it is not of our own making. Another generation has its hands to the plow: they will not engage the world as we did; they are singing a new song."

It is difficult to contemplate the possibility that I may be more resistant to change than I'd like to think I am. Yet, like it or not, I'm kind of becoming my dad! There are emerging styles of music and fashion, entertainment and art that I just don't get. It bothers me in social settings to see people play with their phones, while they ignore those around them. And just when I seem to be getting a handle on some new technology, the manufacturer "updates" it, requiring me to acquire a new set of skills or an entirely new device. And don't get me started on the neighborhood kids playing on the church grounds....[actually, I'm fine with that!]

Approximately 3,000 years ago, the Psalmist wrote "Sing to the Holy One a new song, for God has done marvelous things." [Psalm 98:1]

Apparently, the call for God's people to embrace new ways to praise and serve, worship and witness is actually quite old! ►

The challenge for me, and I imagine for others, is being open to the new, while at the same time trying to figure out which practices and traditions remain relevant, meaningful, and perhaps even essential. If Christianity is to survive and thrive, we must be willing to sing a new song, welcome new expressions and experiences of the Sacred, and take-on the challenging task of contemplating ways to engage people wherever we find them - on social media, at a Hunger Meal, in a community garden, or at the Gay Pride Parade.

Fortunately, this Faith Community has historically embraced, and continues to welcome, new challenges and changes. And I trust that as long as we hang-on to our long-standing tradition and commitment of caring for “the least of these, our sisters and brothers” then our future will always remain bright and blessed.

## **FROM THE MINISTRIES OF BUCC**

### **FACILITIES MINISTRY**



The last stained glass window project by Art Glass is nearing completion. On Saturday May 12, the window will be picked up and framing will be constructed. The window will be installed in the upper Commons Area by Memorial Day weekend.

The project to document all building systems, including hvac, water, sewer and electrical is continuing. The end goal is to have comprehensive documentation available and on file in the office.

The standardization of custodial supplies and their purchasing, from LOGIX located in Richfield, is proceeding. This includes all products Sam uses to maintain the church. New dispensers will be installed for hand soap, paper towels and toilet paper. Sam will have an online account and can order items as necessary that will be drop-shipped or hand delivered. The standardization and wholesale pricing is expected to lower costs after an initial outlay of approximately \$500 for the new dispensers.

The Spring Clean-up of the church property was conducted on May 5. Winter debris was removed, mulch was spread and the old raised bed garden was removed on the rental property. Four new raised beds were installed in open area between the rental property and school property. One of the beds will be used by our tenant Laife and the others by the Sunday School classes.

Several minor repairs have been completed: damaged wood door into the education wing, front door security light and two door closers

Two future capital expense projects are being discussed. The first is the frequent flooding of Pilgrim Hall. ►

A free consultation with a civil engineering firm is being pursued to see what possible remedies there may be. No time has been set and no costs will be available until the consultations are completed and studied. Secondly, the sanctuary roof is nearing the end of its life. Temporary repairs for some missing shingles will be done immediately. Cost estimates will be determined for a complete replacement and the new roof would not be installed until 2019 at the earliest.

## NEWS FROM OCWM



The last hunger meal was served on Sunday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> at Pearl Road United Methodist Church. This meal was a little different, because the church dining area was being used by another church activity, this meal was a “take-out” meal of sandwiches, fruit, and cookies. About 180 thick sandwiches were prepared on site (fat egg salad sandwiches, and fat meat and cheese sandwiches were prepared.

The meat and cheese sandwiches had three slices of ham or turkey and three slices of provolone or swiss. About 180 sandwiches were prepared. The fruit was bananas, and the cookies were prepared by BUCC members. Also bottled water was donated. It was estimated that 70 or 80 persons were served, which means that ample seconds were available. The egg salad was donated. Some meat and cookies were “left over”, and they were taken to St. Hermans as usual.

As far as upcoming hunger meals, BUCC representatives will meet with the Brookside Cluster Community Meal Organization in June or July to select dates and sites for hunger meals during late 2018 and early 2019. It is anticipated that three meals at Bethany and two meals at PRUMC will be served during the coming year, as has been done in the last few years.
