Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Leader: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism bears witness to the Divine Love and Grace that is extended to each of us at every stage of our lives.

People: Today we celebrate God's love for this child, and offer ourselves as instruments of that love in her life.

L: When parents brought their children to Jesus so that he might touch them, his disciples rebuked them; but when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them,

P: "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the Realm of God.

L: Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the Realm of God like a little child, shall not enter it."

P: Then Jesus took the children into his arms and blessed them, laying his hands upon them.

L: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is an outward and visible sign of Divine Grace. Because the promise of the Gospel is not only to us, but also to our children, baptism with water and the Holy Spirit is the mark of their acceptance into the care of Christ's Church. It is the sign and seal of their participation in Divine forgiveness, and the beginning of their growth into full Christian faith.

P: Out of the Water of Holy Baptism, we rise with new life, forgiveness and grace as members of the One Body of Christ.

Readings

The Old Testament - Psalm 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Holy One. Compassionate One, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! If you, O Gracious One, should mark iniquities, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with you, so that you may be revered.

I wait for the Holy One, my soul waits, and in the Holy One's word I hope. My soul waits for the Righteous One more than those who watch for the morning, more than those who watch for the morning.

O Israel, hope in the Holy One! For with the Holy One there is steadfast love, and with the Righteous One is great power to redeem. It is the Holy One who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.

The New Testament - Ephesians 4:1-7

I therefore, as one captivated by the Holy One, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called. With all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, make every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one Divine Source of us all, who is above all and through all and in all. And each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift.

The Continuing Testament - from *Life of the Beloved* - by Henri Nouwen [edited]

At his baptism, Jesus heard it; and we can hear it as well: that Voice which speaks from above and from within, and that whispers softly or declares loudly: "You are my beloved child, and on you my favor rests." It certainly is not easy to hear that voice in a world filled with voices that shout: "You are no good, you are ugly; you are worthless, you are despicable, you are nobody - unless you can demonstrate the opposite."

These negative voices are so loud and so persistent that it is easy to believe them. That's the great trap. It is the trap of self-rejection. Over the years, I have come to realize that the greatest trap in our life is not success, popularity, or power, but self-rejection. Success, popularity and power can, indeed, be a great temptation, but their seductive power often comes from the way they are part of the much larger temptation to self-rejection. For when we have come to believe in the voices that call us worthless and unlovable, then success, popularity and power are easily perceived as attractive solutions.
