

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Leader: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism bears witness to the Divine Love and Grace that is extended to each of us at every age and stage of our lives.

People: Today we celebrate God's love for Carrie and Amy, and offer ourselves as instruments of that love in their lives.

L: Saint Paul writes, "All of us who have been baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into Christ's death.

P: We were buried therefore with Christ, by baptism, into death.

L: So that as Christ was raised from the dead to the glory of God,

All: We too might walk in newness of life!"

L: Holy Baptism is the Sacrament through which we are united with Jesus Christ, and given a role in Christ's ministry of welcome and grace. Baptism is the visible sign of an invisible event: the reconciliation of people to God. It represents the death of a self-serving life, and the rising to a life of self-giving devotion and praise. It also confirms the pouring-out of the Holy Spirit upon all God's people.

P: Out of the Water of Holy Baptism, we rise with new life, forgiveness and grace as members of the One Body of Christ.

Readings

The Old Testament - from Psalm 119

Happy are those whose way is pure, who follow the path of the Holy One. Happy are those who keep God's decrees, who seek the Holy One with their whole heart. You have commanded your ordinances to be kept diligently - O that my ways may be steadfast in keeping them! Then I shall not be put to shame, keeping my eyes set on all your commandments.

I will praise you with an upright heart; when I learn your righteous decrees, I will observe your statutes. With my whole heart I will seek you; I will treasure your word in my heart. With my lips I will declare all the ordinances of your mouth. I will delight in the way of your decrees as much as in all riches. I will meditate on your precepts, and fix my eyes on your ways. I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word.

The New Testament - Mark 10.13-16

People were bringing little children to Jesus so that he might touch them; and the disciples sternly rebuked them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the Realm of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the Realm of God as a little child will never enter it." Then Jesus took the children up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

The Continuing Testament - *God is Still Speaking!* - by Candace Chellew-Hodge [edited]

Those who think the Bible is the be all and end all of what God has taught us, worship not a living God, but a dead, leather-bound one. The Bible didn't swallowed God whole and spit God back at us in the form of rules and regulations. We must remember that God spoke before the Bible was written, and God continues to speak even though the canonization of the Bible is completed. Those who worship the Bible instead of the living, still-speaking God say that God would never do anything to contradict the scripture: but wasn't that the purpose of Jesus' entire ministry? The scriptures said you shall not kill, but Jesus said anyone who is angry with, or even insults, a brother or sister is guilty. The scripture said love your neighbor and hate your enemy, but Jesus said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

These were all brand new things that Jesus taught, and they all contradicted the scripture and the practices of the day. God certainly has a great track record of doing new things that directly contradict biblical traditions. God has liberated the slaves, women and racial minorities; and reformed the idea of marriage to include racial and gender diversity. All these things directly contradict scripture - but they demonstrate, just as effectively as Jesus demonstrated, that God is still speaking, erasing periods, inserting commas, and doing brand new things.
