

BRECKSVILLE UCC MUSIC MINISTRY - Rehearsals for our music ensembles at BUCC will begin this week and next. Here is the schedule of starting dates and times:

Joyful Noise Choir (K through 5th grade): First practice is this Thursday Sept. 6 from 5:30 to 6:15. Fun songs are learned about living Jesus' message of love and respect for others. Singing usually followed by activities, including drawing, games, playground, etc.

Adult Choir (high school students welcome): First rehearsal is this Thursday from **7:00 to 8:30**. **Note new starting time. ** Adult choir is a good way to prepare spiritually for Sunday services, and provides an enjoyable opportunity for choral singing and fellowship in a relaxed, affirming environment.

Youth Percussion Group (6th grade and up): First practice is Sunday Sept. 9 from 5:30-6:00 before youth ministry at 6. Middle school and high school students learn rhythm patterns to accompany music at services, including preludes, offertories, communion and postludes, as well as occasional choir anthems. An ancient form of music-making, playing percussion can help relieve stress while being a gateway to meditation.

Recorder/Dulcimer/Guitar Ensemble (all ages welcome): First practice scheduled for Wednesday Sept. 12 from 4:30-5:00. This group plays prelude music for services about once a month. Listening CDs are provided to help make the learning process easier. Sheet music features both musical notes and musical letters.

Seasonal Choir (high school students welcome): Seasonal choir members fill out the regular choir in presenting BUCC's annual Christmas cantata. Cantata rehearsals will begin on Thurs. Oct. 11 from 7-8:00 PM.

Instrumentalists (all ages welcome): If you play a musical instrument and would be comfortable playing a piece for the congregation (or accompanying choir for an anthem), please let Dave D. know so he can keep you in mind during scheduling process.

Private piano lessons (all ages welcome): If you studied with Dave last spring, he will be in touch about this year's schedule. If you would like to start taking lessons, contact Dave to schedule. Lessons usually take place on Wednesdays and Thursdays. As we begin our new church season, give some prayerful thought to participating in BUCC's music program in some way. ▶

Readings

The Old Testament - Jeremiah 7:1-7

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Holy One: Stand in the gate of the Temple and proclaim there this word, and say, "Hear the word of the Holy One, all you people of Judah, you that enter these gates to worship the Holy One. Thus, says the Sovereign of Hosts, the God of Israel: 'Amend your ways and your doings, and let me dwell with you in this place. Do not seek protection in this empty phrase: "This is the temple of the Holy One, the temple of the Holy One, the temple of the Holy One." For if you truly amend your ways and your doings, if you truly act justly one with another, if you do not oppress the alien, the orphan, and the widow, or shed innocent blood in this place, and if you do not go after other gods to your own hurt, then I will dwell with you in this place, in the land that I gave of old to your ancestors forever and ever.

The New Testament - Mark 7:1-15; 21

When the Pharisees and scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without ritually washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders, And they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked Jesus, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" He said to them, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines.' You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition."

Then he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to keep your tradition! For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever speaks evil of father or mother must surely die.' But you say that if anyone tells father or mother, 'Whatever support you might have had from me is *Corban* (that is, "an offering to God") - then you no longer permit doing anything for a father or mother, thus making void the word of God through your tradition that you have handed on. And you do many things like this."

Then he called the crowd and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.... For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come."

The Continuing Testament - Why Don't You Wash Your Hands? - by Samuel Candler [edited]

Though the tradition of washing hands had begun for the Pharisees in all sincerity, by Jesus' time a certain fear had set-in. Their system of ritual performance had grown so rigid that it had taken control of them. Everything they did hinged on the concern that maybe they would be breaking a law; and if one part of the tradition were to be broken, than maybe the whole tradition would die out; and if the tradition died out, then maybe the whole faith would die out as well.

Fear does that to people. It turns minor concerns into obsessions. We are afraid that if something in our system of belief fails, then we will fail. If something in our society changes, then our society is broken. Fear distorts reality, so that the important concerns of our life are missed. In short, fear can be a paralyzing power; but there is a way out. It is the way of Divine Grace and Freedom that is revealed in Jesus, and offered to us all.

Jesus ate with outcasts, and ran-around with "unclean" people. He plucked grain on the Sabbath. He ate without washing his hands! He was free not to be frightened of society or of his enemies, but to speak truth to them in love. It is the freedom of Jesus that enables him to accept those who are different. It is that same freedom which allows you and me to look at ourselves honestly, and to accept the Divine Grace that Jesus Christ offers. It is that freedom which, finally, empowers us to love ourselves and to truly love one another.
